Just a reminder that earrings (if worn) should be a small stud and not hoops. If children are wearing hoops, they will be asked to take them out. Please ensure that the children wear the correct PE uniform and not hoodies as a jumper.

It is vital that children are prepared for the changing weather so can we ask that your child comes to school with a coat.

The children will be outside for break times and for learning, so it is important that they are dressed appropriately, especially if it is lightly raining as they will still be outdoors.


House System

In school, we have chosen to introduce a 'house' system to further foster our sense of belonging and community. The house system will also be used as a vehicle to introduce competitive sports within school. Every half-term, the children in either EYFS/KS1 or KS2 will be invited to join an afterschool competition (non-compulsory) where the houses can compete to win the house cup for the half term. The first competition will be a hockey tournament held on Wednesday 15th October from 3:30-4:30. Our Burntstump families are welcome to come and watch.

In addition to this, the children can earn tokens for their house. These will be placed in a pot and, every half-term, the winning house will receive a reward.


