### **Welcome Back to the start of the New academic year**

Wow, where did the 6 week summer holidays go? We hope you have had a lovely break and enjoyed some special family time with your children. The children have been amazing and settled so well into their new classes this morning. Already, we have begun to move straight into learning mode with our focus for the first few days being our Personal development curriculum and thinking about how Zones of Regulation (see diagram at end of newsletter) help us become more resilient and support positive mental health.



A special welcome to parents/carers who are joining the school this academic year, whether this is in Nursery, Reception or other year groups, we are looking forward to sharing this important part of your child's Primary school education with you.

You will find in this month's newsletter information about the best and quickest way to contact your child's class teacher. Please can we ask that you follow this information and not to request to see the class teacher between 8:45 am and 3:30 pm, as all teachers are in class during these hours. Using the methods suggested in the newsletter they will get back to you as soon as they can or other staff will be happy to assist.

The new academic year always brings lots of exciting opportunities to enrich the curriculum with visits and visitors. You will see on the diary dates page of the newsletter that some year groups will be having educational visits or will be having visitors in their class to support their curriculum. Every class will have at least one educational visit during the academic year, which is fully funded from our school budget. There may also be other opportunities as funding or grants permit. As a school we will not ask for any contribution to these visits from parents/carers. This is challenging for us with school budgets having been underfunded for many years. However, we will continue to fund visits and visitors during the academic year 2025-26. In order to maintain this stance please help us during other fund-raising activities across the year e.g. Christmas and Summer Fayre raffles etc. These will be announced via the newsletter nearer the time of the event.

Finally, we are always looking for ways to make communication easier between home and school. For the last couple of years, we have used the Tapestry App in Nursery and Reception to share good things which a child has been doing in school, as well as share information. Parents have been very positive about the use of Tapestry, which has the feel of a social media type communication tool. We have decided to roll this App out across the school and you will receive information about signing up to Tapestry in the next couple of days. Teachers and TA's will then use this to send out information, including photos and videos of what your child has been up to in school direct to your phone.

If you have a concern or think that we can be of any help about any aspect of school life then please do not hesitate to get in touch.

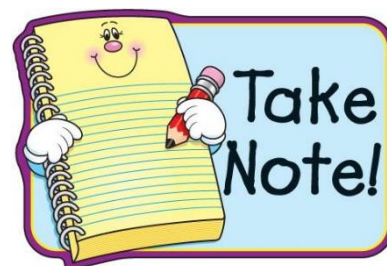

Thank you for encouraging your children and enabling them to wear school uniform – they look great! Wearing a uniform really does also help pupils remember to turn to work mode and recognise summer time is now over. Please could we just offer a gentle reminder that unless a child has just had their ears pierced during the holidays then earrings should be removed for school, and no other jewellery should be worn. If you have queries about the uniform policy then please follow the link below or pop in for a chat with myself or your child's class teacher. If a child has recently had ears pierced then they must be covered by tape during the school day.

We are in the process of reviewing this policy and will include permission to wear small transparent, rubber stud type earrings during the school day. As these have no metal peg, the risk of the ear being torn during a knock when taking part in PE lessons or during playtimes is reduced significantly.

The current policy also reminds everyone about the appropriate styles for hair-cuts, as well as confirming that coloured hair is not permitted and not part of our uniform.

We would love to have more volunteers helping in school, whether that be with the PTA, as a reading buddy for our pupils or when we take children on visits. If you think that you can help then please have a chat with your child's class teacher, Mr Jones or Miss Mitcheson.

We will then discuss the opportunities and the process of a DBS check, which would be required for these roles, as well as training we can provide to help with the role.



If you arrive after 8:55 am please bring your child to the main school office as other school gates will be closed.



Where do I drop off my child on a morning and where do I pick-up at the end of the school day?



On a morning, 8:45 am, Reception pupils enter via their classroom door, Year 1, 2 and 3 pupils enter via their cloakroom entrance. Reception and Year 3 pupils can be collected from their doors at 3:25 pm and 3:30 pm respectively. Nursery pupils enter and leave school via their own doors.

At the end of the school day, 3:25 pm, Year 1 pupils are collected from the KS1 playground next to the adventure playground. Year 2 pupils are collected from the corner of the building as you enter the playground at the opposite corner to this area.



Year 4, 5 and 6 pupils should enter school by the gate adjacent to the KS2 playground – Mr Jones usually greets pupils and parents here from 8:45 – 8:55 am.

At the end of the school day – 3:30 pm - pupils will be brought to this playground by their teachers for collection by parents/carers.



### How to contact your child's class teacher.

If you feel that it would be helpful to pass information to your child's class teacher on a morning or have an urgent question/query, please could we ask that you pop into school or ring between 8:30 - 8:45 am. **The class teachers are all in the classroom from 8:45 am when the school day begins and they will not be available from 8:45 am.**

You can however, speak to Mr Jones at the KS2 entry gate or one of our TA's at the Reception class, KS1 and KS2 entry doors.

Teacher's will always be available at the end of the school day and would love to chat at that time.

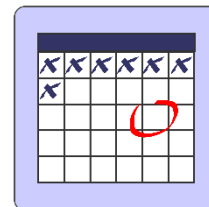
