

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Clarinet Lessons

As an experienced KS1, Primary teacher and a Music Graduate, who specialised in Clarinet performance I have excellent skills to be able to teach young children the Clarinet.

I truly believe that learning an instrument has a hugely powerful impact on a child's life; the friends, opportunities and experiences that being able to play an instrument brings are endless.

In my teaching I endeavour to make learning fun, enjoyable and to cultivate a love of learning. Here are some reviews from current students' parents:

'My child's confidence has grown over the past year and now she can play many pieces of music confidently, she got to show off her skills at the Clarinet recital which was great to attend as a parent'

I offer 20 minute 1:1 Clarinet lessons in schools for children in Y2 or above.

I provide a student Clarinet for children to play on. You just need to pay an initial fee, £23, to buy your child's mouthpiece, an ABRSM journal and the Abracadabra Clarinet music book. I will bring all these along to their first lesson.

Each lesson costs £8.50, each week I will write an update in your child's journal. At the end of each term you will receive an individual report about your child's progress, which notes they can play and the musical theory they have learnt. At your school's convenience I also offer a Clarinet Recital. This is an opportunity for the children to show off what they have achieved. This year my Clarinettists performed duets alongside myself, with peers and some performed as soloists. Some played multiple pieces and others built up the courage to play once. No one needs to take part it is simply another opportunity that learning the Clarinet offers them.

I am passionate about children's learning and Music and as a Clarinet teacher I aim to provide high quality outstanding teaching but also give children the opportunities I had. Through playing the Clarinet I travelled with a county band and played alongside my teenage peers in cities and even conducted a Big Band and performed as a soloist. Learning an instrument truly is a gift that lasts a lifetime.
