#### **Uniform**

#### **Breakfast Club Christmas Craft**

On Mondays and Thursdays between now and Christmas, Breakfast Club will be running Craft sessions in addition to the normal offer. Please book in the normal way if you would like your child to come along! Breakfast will be included of course! Working parents of Primary School aged children who are accessing before and after school childcare (also known as wraparound provision) can use **Tax-Free** 

<u>Childcare</u> or <u>Universal Credit Childcare</u> to help pay for Breakfast and After School childcare.

Tax-Free Childcare can be used by working families with children aged 0-11 years and earning under £100k and at least £167 per week, and who aren't receiving Universal Credit or Tax Credits. For every £8 you pay into an online account, the government will add an extra £2, up to £2000 per child per year.

Universal Credit Childcare can be used by working families claiming Universal Credit with children under 17 years old. Up to 85% of eligible childcare costs can be reclaimed. Parents will need to speak to their work coach for more information. Find out more information from the Childcare Choices website.

Did you know you can use Tax-Free Childcare or Universal Credit Childcare to help pay for before and after school childcare?

#### Winter Wear- Coats and Shoes

#### **Long Hair**

Could we remind all families that children who have long hair (girls and boys) should have it tied back all the time. It is not just a PE requirement, it is for Health and Safety reasons and it also helps to keep head lice transmission down if hair is tied up. If children come into school with their hair down, they will be asked to tie it up.
