Circumstances do change so we advise children having their PE kit in school at all times. We will send it home each half term for a freshen up!



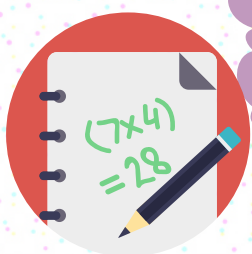
## MATHS

This term we will be focusing primarily on multiplication, Fractions and Time.

As in previous terms we continue to consolidate our arithmetic through daily 'Fluent in Five' strategies as well as weekly practice opportunities.

To ensure progression of skills and mastery of understanding we following the stages of fluency followed by reasoning and problem solving. Children are encouraged to expand on their answers and show understanding of how an answer has been reached.

Your child's ability to quickly recall the multiplication facts up to  $12 \times 12$  has a significant impact on their ability to master other concepts. Please support your child's multiplication practice at home.

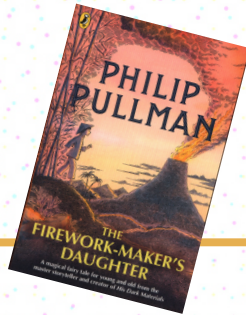




# Reading

All children are exposed to a wide range of texts across our school curriculum as part of our promotion of reading.

Within class children have daily Taught Reading sessions which focus on a whole text, allowing children to fully immerse in the story. Taught Reading sessions are focused on vocabulary, inference, comprehension, retrieval, summary and prediction. This term the children will be studying 'The Firework Maker's Daughter' by Phillip Pullman.

## HOMEWORK AND HOME LEARNING

- Daily Reading - at least 10 minutes aloud to an adult, this should be recorded on Boom Reader by logging into an adult's account.
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- Daily recall of Multiplication and Division facts - using Times Tables Rockstars.
