
Young Voices




Changes to administering paracetamol

Please note that paracetamol will only be given for pain relief, such as headaches or mild aches, and will not be administered to reduce a raised temperature.

In line with NHS guidance, if a child has a temperature of 38°C or above, they will be considered unwell and will need to be collected and taken home. This is to ensure the wellbeing of the child and to reduce the risk of illness spreading to others.

If your child has a medical condition that requires regular or prescribed use of paracetamol, parents/carers must provide their own supply, clearly labelled with the child's name, along with the appropriate medical documentation and consent forms. Unfortunately, we are unable to administer paracetamol for medical needs without these in place.


