Stocks Lane Uniform Policy

Introduction

It is our school policy that all children wear school uniform when attending school, or when participating in school-organised events outside normal school hours. A complete list of the items needed for school uniform including those for Physical Education, is listed below:

High standards of personal presentation support our positive learning ethos and school uniform provides a sense of unity and pride. Parents are asked for full support and co-operation to ensure that all children wear school uniform.

Our uniform can be purchased through EIH at The Old Barn on Highgate Road. They also sell a selection of waterproof jackets, fleeces, pump bags and book bags with the school logo on. School also sells ties made from recyclable materials, which are available to purchase from the office. As only the jumper needs the school logo, the rest of the uniform may be purchased from the supermarkets.

School Uniform List

FS & Key Stages 1 children

- Grey trousers, skirt, skorts, culottes or pinafore dress- *Leggings are not permitted*
- White polo shirt
- Navy blue sweatshirt or cardigan with logo
- Black school shoes or sensible ankle boots with grey or white socks or grey tights -not trainers or glittery shoes
- Summer- Grey shorts or navy blue and white checked (all over) summer short-sleeved dresses or skorts
- Grey or white socks and black or white sandals

Key Stage 2 children

- Grey trousers, skirt, skorts, culottes or pinafore dress- *Leggings are not permitted*
- White shirt or blouse with a collar
- Navy blue v-neck sweatshirt or cardigan with logo
- School tie (navy and green)
- Black school shoes or sensible ankle boots with grey or white socks or grey tights- not trainers or glittery shoes
- Summer- Grey shorts or navy blue and white checked (all over) summer short-sleeved dresses
- Grey or white socks and black or white sandals
- Navy blue or black Hijabs

Key Stages FS, 1 & 2 Games/ PE

Indoors

- White t-shirt (with or without school logo)
- Navy or black shorts/ leggings or mid-thigh length cycling shorts- BUT NOT binding/ runner/ pants type 'short' shorts
- White or grey socks and a pair of pumps

Outdoors

- White t-shirt (with or without school logo)
- Navy shorts or black shorts/ leggings or mid-thigh length cycling shorts- BUT NOT binding/ runner/ pants type 'short' shorts
- Navy jogging bottoms & navy-blue sweatshirt
- White or grey socks and trainers

The children will also need:

- A book bag with logo for KS1.
- KS2 children may bring a small black or navy rucksack which will be stored on their peg and so must be of a small size- No handbag types please
- Please ensure that all your child's clothing and footwear is clearly labelled with their name.

Jewellery, Watches, Hair Ornaments, Make-up and Nail Varnish

For health and safety reasons we do not allow children to wear jewellery. The exceptions to this rule are ear-ring studs in pierced ears, and small objects of religious significance. Children are required to remove any items during PE lessons to prevent them from causing injury. Please note: Teachers are not permitted to remove pupil's earrings.

Wrist watches may be worn but only for the purpose of telling the time. 'Smart' watches linked to mobile phones are not permitted.

Hair bands, ribbons/bows or 'scrunchies' should be plain and either blue, black or white in colour. Hair bands should not have large flowers attached. Make up and nail varnish should not be worn to school.

Extreme hairstyles are not appropriate for school. The use of styling products should be kept to a minimum and children should not have decorative patterns or 'tram lines' cut into their hair or have their hair coloured or dyed. For health and safety reasons and to ensure it does not distract from learning, we advise that long hair be tied back.

The Role of Parents and Carers

We believe that one of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform and PE kit, and that it is clean, in good repair and that the child's name is written on all items. If a parent has difficulties for any reason with fulfilling this request they are asked to speak confidentially to a senior member of staff to discuss the issues. Parents should be assured that we will do all we can to help. Any parents or carers who are entitled to the Pupil Premium Funding are eligible for vouchers towards the cost of the uniform.

Failure to comply with school uniform will result in the child receiving negative Dojos for incorrect uniform and if repeated, being sent home to change, in line with DFE guidance.

The Role of Governors

The Governing Body supports the Headteacher in implementing the school uniform policy. It considers all representations from parents regarding the uniform policy and liaises with the headteacher to ensure that the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity. It is the governors' responsibility to ensure that the school uniform meets all regulations concerning equal opportunities. Governors ensure that the school uniform policy enables children to dress sensibly, in clothing that is hard wearing, affordable, safe and practical.
