For number day in Willow we have been finding different representations of numbers up to 10, printing our own number blocks using sponges and paint and practicing making doubles by building cube towers! We have also been practicing counting up to 10 and back down to 0.

Laurel class have been exploring numbers to 50 and 100 today by building them, putting them in order and making them using 2 numbers and their knowledge of addition and subtraction. We have had so much fun!

Sycamore Class have been learning the 2, 5 and 10 times tables today for number day. We danced to the times table songs by BBC super movers and we made multiplication wheels and flowers using the times tables we have learnt.

Rowan Class

NSPCC Number Day has been such good fun! The children in Rowan class are fascinated with the number 67 at the moment so we used this as a starting point for our Number Day activities. We started by creating 67 artwork in the style of artist Nnena Kalu who is currently featuring at Cartwright Hall. We then practiced our 6 and 7 times tables using TTRS and "Laugh Along and Learn" times table music tracks. We spent the afternoon investigating the number 67 through a range of questions: Can you find an object that weighs exactly 67grams? How many ways can you make 67? How many ways can you make 67 pence? How many ways can you build 67? It has been a very mathematical kind of day!

Cherry Blossom Class

Today we have been discussing our dream jobs and how Maths might be used in those and other daily jobs. We came up with some very interesting ideas! We then played a game with the hundred square. We closed our eyes and picked a number and our partner then had to find the number bond to 100. We have also completed a secret subtraction code breaker to reveal a secret message about money.

Oak Class

Oak class have been completing various mathematical activities including sudoku and magic squares.

Acer Class

For NSPCC Number Day, Acer Class took part in a range of fun and engaging maths activities. The children explored real-life problem solving by comparing different mobile phone contracts and deciding which option offered the best value based on a given scenario. 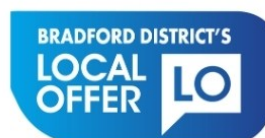
