
Tirlebrook Newsletter 2 (23-24)

Mrs. Featonby writes,








Charity



Harvest Assembly - Monday 2nd October @ 9 a.m.

We will be holding our Harvest Assembly, a week on Monday, the 2nd October, and as part of this, will be collecting both food and monetary donations on behalf of the residents of Barton Court and Tewkesbury Foodbank. If you feel able to, we would be delighted for you to be involved. Donations of low stock essential items would be very gratefully appreciated for Tewkesbury Foodbank and these include (please note I have included a couple of non-traditional Harvest items too!): UHT milk (long-life semi-skimmed), breakfast cereals, pasta sauce, long-life fruit juice, tinned meat, tinned carrots,

tinned peas, tea, coffee, ketchup, brown sauce, shower gel, shampoo and small packs of washing powder. However, all food donations of fruit, vegetables, cans, tins, packets, bottles and cartons are welcomed. Any monetary donations will be used to provide vouchers for those in need from local businesses Kevin Mace the Butchers and Woody's Greengrocers.

If you feel able to support Barton Court residents Tewkesbury Foodbank, we will begin collecting from Monday 25th September. We are requesting that food donations brought into school are deposited on a trolley at the main school gate; a bucket will also be at the main school gate daily for any financial gifts.
