
Tirlebrook Newsletter 3 (23-24)

Information for Families

Reducing Absenteeism due to Illness - A Letter from the Chief Medical Officer

The Chief Medical Officer and others have written to schools with advice on when a child should stay off school and when they are likely to be well enough to attend, even when feeling less than 100%

well. The letter advises that children should remain in school with mild respiratory illnesses, however, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above. It encourages parents and carers to refer to the NHS guidance <u>Is my child too ill for school? - NHS (www.nhs.uk)</u> to support decision making about absence from school due to ill health.

Those who have signed the letter include Professor Chris Whitty (Chief Medical Officer, England), Pat Cullen (General Secretary, Royal College of Nursing), Professor Kamila Hawthorne (Chair, Royal College of General Practitioners), Dr. Camilla Kingdon (President, Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health) and William Roberts (Chief Executive, Royal Society for Public Health).

We all recognise the importance of children attending school every day. However, it is never an easy decision to send a child into school when they are feeling below par. Indeed, it is completely understandable that children are sometimes poorly, and for their own good, as well as the good of others, it is better for them to rest at home and recover. Hopefully the above advice will help parents and carers to make the correct decision for their child - and this is never straightforward. If we believe a child has come to school and is not well enough to be with us, or becomes too unwell throughout the course of the day, we will make contact with you and request that they are taken home. Please also remember the 48 -hour rule for episodes of sickness and diarrhoea - children should remain off school until 48-hours after the last event. Thank you for your understanding and continued support.

All classes are held at Target Active Fitness in Tewkesbury.



Harvest Assembly - Monday 2nd October @ 9 a.m.

However, all food donations of fruit, vegetables, cans, tins, packets, bottles and cartons are welcomed. I'm hoping to have completed in time for Halloween: a standing Wicked Witch of the West, a flying monkey carrying Toto away, a melted Wicked Witch of the West, a squashed Wicked Witch of the East, and an apple tree with a face.

They'll be on display on Barton Road, GL20 5QL, near the hospital.
