
Tirlebrook Newsletter 1 (23-24)

Pupil Leadership

House Captain Elections

This week has seen our House Captains elected for the year ahead and **Beauchamp**, **Hastings**, **Montague** and **Wenlock** have their new leaders in place. These elections always form an important part of the school calendar. Our House Captains are role models throughout the school as well as ambassadors for Tirlebrook and they will have the chance to lead in various ways in this their final year at primary school.

The election of House Captains is always a challenging time for the Y6 children. Our process is democratic and the votes collated from the children in each house dictate who will be given the role each year. For most, to fulfil this role is a long-held ambition, and there will always be more children who are disappointed than delighted as the great majority will not have been successful in being selected. However, it is really important that the children are not discouraged from giving things a try due to a fear of 'failing' or not getting the result they wanted - putting yourself forward for such an opportunity is an excellent thing to do. It is important that the children take up every opportunity that comes their way - we always encourage the children to 'make the most of every moment'.

We are really proud of our Y6 children. By participating in the House Captain election, they are clearly exhibiting our core values – showing **Creativity** in preparing and sharing speeches, demonstrating a **Positive Attitude** when celebrating success or facing disappointment and displaying **Community** by responding to each other's feelings with care and respect. It really is an opportunity for growth – and one that we should welcome even when things don't go our way. Dealing with success and disappointment appropriately and proportionately and doing so with emotional intelligence is an important life lesson and one that many of us as adults continue to have to deal with on a daily basis. It's hard! But we only get better at dealing with things by experience. This isn't just a learning curve for our Y6 children in relation to house captaincy, rather dealing with success and disappointment is something that all of our children in school need to be able to accept. It is natural for us not to want to see our children face the harsh realities of being overlooked, being let down, things going against them and things going wrong and upsetting them. But it will happen. Disappointment and things not going our way is inevitable – it is part of life and one of life's hardest and sometime harshest lessons. Let's allow our children to become more resilient and embrace this!
