# DIGITAL ADMISSION APPLICATIONS FOR CHILDREN STARTING P1 IN SEPTEMBER 2024

The Education Authority (EA) uses an online application process for admissions for primary school. A portal for places for the September 2024 intake in which parents can apply online for a place is currently being updated. The Go Live date for the new digital admissions is **Tuesday 9th January 2024 at 12 Noon.** The closing time and date for applications will be **12 Noon on 26th January 2024.** Applications after 26<sup>th</sup> January will be considered as late.

#### **STRIKE ACTION**

The school workforce will form part of a day of mass action which will bring Northern Ireland to a standstill next Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> January to involve teachers, classroom assistants, nurses, transport workers and civil servants.

School will be closed all day on THURSDAY 18<sup>th</sup> JANUARY as all staff - teaching and non-teaching have been called to strike.

General Secretary of the Ulster Teachers' Union, Jacquie White, said it was "unfortunate" there had been no moves to seek resolution over the Christmas and New Year break.

"UTU, alongside the four other main teaching unions in Northern Ireland, has therefore been left with no option but to formally inform our employers of our decision," she said.

"It is with the heaviest of hearts that each and every member feels cornered into this action given that our long-running pay claim began in 2020. Alternative lesser actions have unfortunately made no difference in securing Northern Ireland teachers' parity with their counterparts elsewhere in GB."

"With newly qualified teachers' salaries here an astonishing £8,000 below those just a few miles away in, for instance, Scotland, we can no longer allow our profession to be treated so contemptibly.

"Despite the fact that funding for the public sector pay claim has been identified within the offer made by the Secretary of State, there appears to be no political will – or plan - to deliver.

"Meanwhile teachers continue to hold together a system which is crumbling beneath the weight of long-term under-investment, a system which is short-changing our children and risking our future socio-economic success as a country."

She said the authorities must start to listen to the cries from within the profession that it is "haemorrhaging its best people" and failing to attract new teachers.

"For too long now we, as teachers, have been papering over the cracks and doing our very best to make a broken system work," she added.

"The savage nature of cuts in recent times is having an undeniable ripple effect that goes a long way beyond the classroom.

"Our industrial action is about advocating for a better future for our children who are being denied essential services.

"We do not want to be in this position, but we intend to fulfil the commitment we made before Christmas and engage in further action until this issue is resolved.

"We call on the Department of Education, local politicians and the Secretary of State to deliver a mechanism for resolution."

#### P1-P3 CHANGE OF MORNING ENTRANCE

P1 and P2 should come into school via the front door in the mornings.

P3 should come in via the side gate outside P7 along with the P4-7 classes.

Staff will be on hand as usual to direct and help the children.

#### **SUSTRANS - WALK UP THE HILL WEDNESDAYS**

We will be continuing with our walk up the hill Wednesdays. These small efforts are to help encourage our pupils to adopt a healthy lifestyle and increase their level of exercise.

#### ATTENDANCE

The best attendance in school in December was P1 who had 97.4% attendance. Well done!

We believe regular attendance at school is crucial to allow every child to fulfil their potential. We are committed to providing an education of the highest quality for all our pupils. We believe high attainment depends on good attendance. Attendance is recorded twice daily on sims.net. A full attendance requires a child being present for the entire day. If a child is sent home due to illness, they will be marked absent for the afternoon session. If they go to an appointment this will also be marked as an absence.

#### **PUNCTUALITY**

At the beginning of the year, many of us start with new year resolutions. With this in mind we would like to remind you that our school day starts at 9.05 am and that all children should be in school for this time. Our assemblies begin at 9.05 and we have noticed that there are quite a few children who are entering school late. Children who arrive after 9.15 receive a late mark.

#### **BREAKFAST AND SNACK**

Reminder – the school, kitchen is no longer providing breakfast or snacks at this time, due to ongoing action short of strike. Pupils need to bring their own snack every day, as the kitchen will not be selling fruit or bagels until further notice.

Monday and Friday are fruit days. We are a health promoting school so snacks should be healthy for example pancake, crackers, cheese, yoghurt and remember snacks must be **NUT FREE**. Check ingredients of cereal bars please, as many contain nuts. Remember **no Nutella**.
