## November Newsletter

Curriculum year group updates:

We are coming to the end of our exciting 'Tribal Tales' topic in Year 3, finishing with wonderful clay pottery inspired by the Beaker People — the children worked brilliantly and the results look fantastic! Our next topic, 'Tremors', takes us deep into the Earth. Children will learn about the structure of the Earth, volcanic activity and different types of soil. They will also study the



events of Pompeii and use their knowledge to explore seismographs. In computing, they will continue to explore the importance of online safety. We'll be creating Christmas-themed letters linked to our class book 'The Christmasaurus' in our writ-



ing lessons. The children are already enjoying the story, and we can't wait to see the writing it inspires. We will focus on building confidence with times tables and begin a new maths unit on measurement, exploring the perimeter of different shapes and how to calculate it. There will be no dormant learning this block, the children will be erupting with knowledge!

In Year 4 and 5, we are really looking forward to Block 3 and our new topic of 'Princes and Peasants'. During this block, we will be exploring medieval England, the monarchy from Edward III in 1216 to Richard the III in 1485, the battle of Hastings, the battle of Bosworth and what life would have been like for each tier on the hierarchy. Excitingly, we have an upcoming trip to the King Richard III Visitor Centre to learn all about his life, his death and debate the myths that surround his reign. The children will have the opportunity to also see the site where his body was exhumed and his burial site in Leicester Cathedral. In maths, we will be exploring multiplication and division, whilst making connections to our prior learning to help us solve problems. In English, we are writing to persuade with letters of complaint about King Richard III!

Year Six are looking forward to starting their new topic: Frozen Kingdoms, which will be launched by Simon the Explorer. He will share with the children information about his expeditions to the North and South Pole and will even share gruesome pictures of frostbite for those who are brave enough to look! The children will use their scientific skills to explore animal adaptations. They will use their geographical skills to think about climate zones, time zones and natural resourcing. Year Six will also explore what climate change means and how they can make positive choices to protect the environment. In writing, children will be producing diary entries based on historical figures who raced to reach the South Pole first. They will also be composing newspaper articles to inform their readers about significant events

As part of our work to make sure every child feels welcome and included, we are excited to share that we are working towards the Leicestershire County Council Beyond Bullying Award. This award recognises positive work around friendship, behaviour and preventing bullying. As part of the process, we will be asking for feedback from the whole school community, including parents and carers, so look out for a Microsoft Forms link soon. We will also be sharing our updated Bullying Prevention Policy, along with a child-friendly version that is being developed with pupils.
