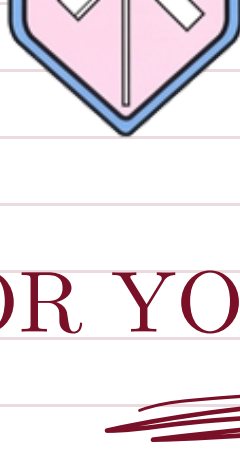
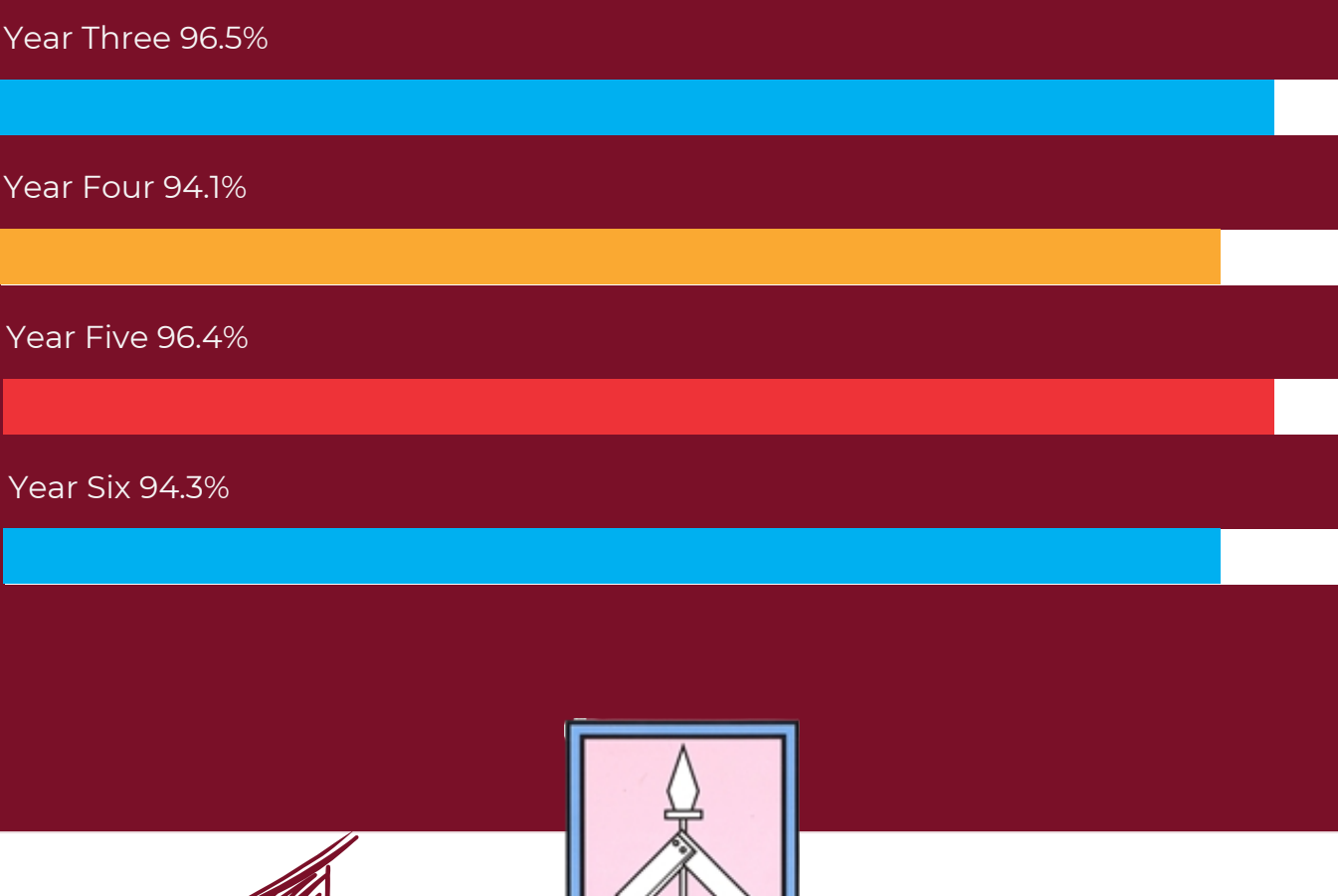
SAT's
