

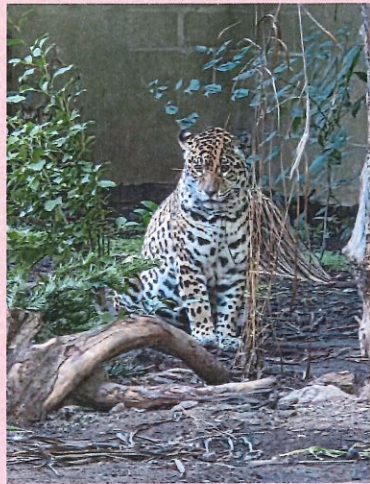
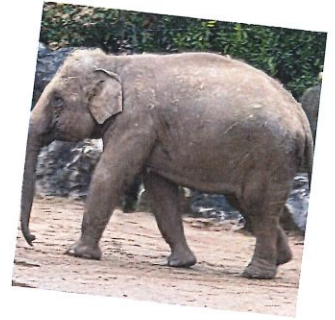

Year Five

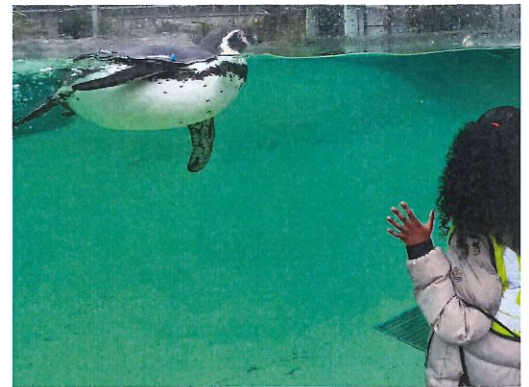
