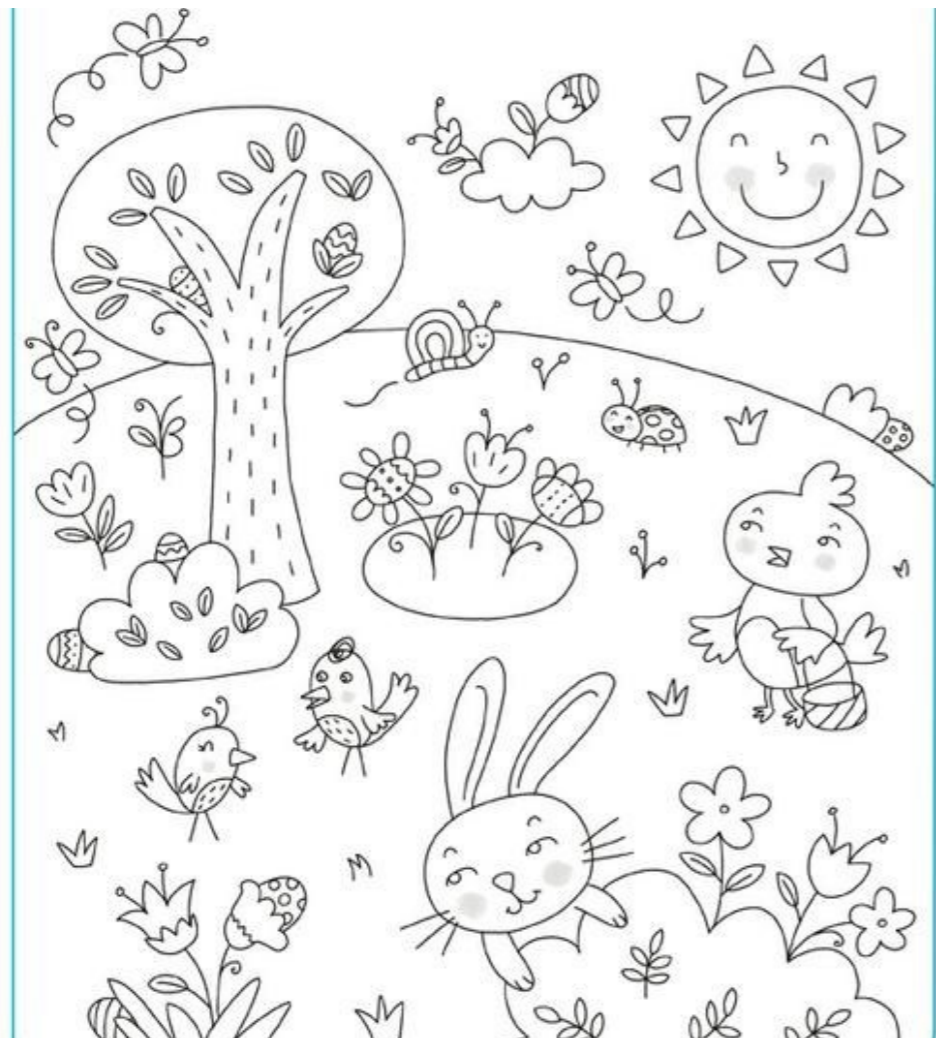

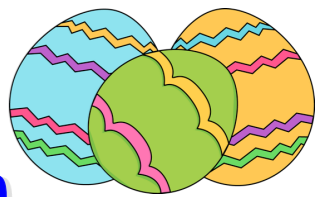

## The British Red Cross

Year 6 had an exciting afternoon last term when a first aid instructor from the British Red Cross came into class. They came to teach the children some important life saving skills. The session was full of demonstrations with a real life model and also included lots of practical tips which would be helpful in real emergency situations. The visitor began the session by explaining why first aid is so important and how small actions can help keep someone safe until an adult or medical professional arrives. The class learnt how to cool burns under cold running water. They were told the reasons why our bodies bruise and how we can reduce swelling by using something cold. The children also discussed what to do if somebody may have broken a bone. They learnt to keep the person still, to avoid moving the injured body part and to get help from an adult straight away. The class enjoyed the session and came away feeling more confident to support somebody in a medical emergency.
