

#### Spring term review

I think it is safe to say that spring term 2020 was one of the most unusual I've ever experienced in over 25 years of teaching. It is thanks to the support of the parents, staff and governors that we have continued to work to the best of our ability and with almost all staff in



school throughout the lockdown. Dealing with last minute announcements made by the government has definitely had its challenges when trying to support parents and pupils and staff! However, I feel we have been very fortunate to have received so much positive feedback from parents - particularly when families have been facing such difficult times themselves.

It has been a balancing act for teachers when setting work for home learning: some parents have been under enormous pressure just sorting childcare and managing children being at home all day; others have wanted extra work as they have the capacity to do more home schooling. I know some parents have felt obliged to complete school work for several hours every day, doing a million engaging, educationally challenging activities involving long division, accurate use of semi-colons, and a high degree of understanding of the social context of the periods when England was invaded - what *did* the Romans ever do for us? However, as a parent myself, I understand the challenges of working full-time and trying to engage children in home learning, and, as I have said in countless emails and letters, we have to be kind to ourselves. Our first priority continues to be a focus on wellbeing - our children's and our own ... and to avoid the unrealistic expectations often posted on social media.

We have had some wonderful emails, photos and videos of how families have been spending their time together, and Mr Hooson has done a great job of updating the website with examples of what you have achieved at home. The staff have also commented on how interesting it is getting your class emails, so keep them coming for the rest of term.

#### Looking ahead to summer and beyond

Many people are beginning to ask about the summer holidays and our plans for <sup>-</sup> September. School will be closed for the duration of the holidays due to major building work (see over for more details). Don't forget, we break up on Friday 17th July.

With regards to the autumn term, at this point in time, the government has said that it is their intention for all children to be back in school in September. Obviously, this is subject to change by the government, and we can only plan with what we know. However, as soon as we get more information, we will let parents know.



In the meantime, we will plan for children to be back in September. We are aware that children will come back into school with a wide range of different experiences of life during the pandemic and lockdown. Therefore, there will be a wide range of needs, both academic and social, emotional and mental health (SEMH) wise. Parents should be reassured that staff will focus on assessing children's individual needs, and we will work closely with families to provide a supportive transition back into school.

Miss Hutchinson, who had a placement with the current Reception class this year, has already been working in school during the last term. Mr Walsh has seen many staff and pupils come and go since he started as superintendent in June 1991.
