

Class 3 champions







### Covid-19 update

A new risk assessment will be issued by Leeds City Council shortly. This will be on our website by the end of term <a href="Covid-19 Risk assessment">Covid-19 Risk assessment</a>. Based on current government guidance, we are anticipating that there will be no restrictions in place when we return to school in September. However, we have to prepare an Outbreak Management Plan which may involve the re-introduction of some restrictions. This will only be put in place if there is a local outbreak and we are instructed to employ specific control measures by Public Health England or the local authority. If this were to be the case, we would inform you via ClassDojo as soon as the information is received by us.
