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Dear Parents & Carers

This week in Willow class we have been reading the book 'Meesha makes friends'. We have been talking about the different ways we could make friends with the other children in the class. In PE we went on an adventure (an assault course) to get to a castle. We have continued to explore the theme of autumn by conker rolling, autumn leaf rubbing and observing the autumn changes in the outdoor learning area.

This week in Year 2, our budding authors have been busy crafting imaginative stories inspired by Zog. The children have shown fantastic effort and creativity, and we're looking forward to compiling their work into a class book to share next week! In Maths, we explored fact families within 20, using resources to deepen our understanding of numbers. In Art, nature took centre stage as we used leaves to create beautiful line drawings of organic shapes. Meanwhile in Science, we investigated the importance of a healthy diet and learnt about the different food groups that help keep our bodies strong and energised.

Reception classes have started to explore our new book 'Lost and Found' by Oliver Jeffers. At the beginning of the week, we were visited by a very sad looking penguin and the children talked about what they thought could be wrong and how we could help. Later, we received a letter telling us that the penguin was lost and needed our help! We talked about all the different ways that we could help including building a boat, building an aeroplane, finding his friend and returning him to his family. The children came up with some fantastic ideas and have loved making boats and painting their own penguin pictures. In phonics this week the children have been learning the sounds z, x and recapping our set 1 sounds. The children have also been practicing reading simple CVC words e.g. mad, mat, sad, dad, sat. In math's, we have been learning about 'mass' and 'capacity.' We have been practicing using the language of heavy, heavier, heaviest, and light, lighter, lightest as well as empty, half full and full. Over the next week we will be sending your child's wellingtons home for half term. Please can you check the size over the half-term break. Wellingtons will be needed when the children return to school.

Year 1 have been focusing on sentence structure this week. We are so proud of the progress the children have made with their sentences already this year. They are becoming much more consistent with their capital letters and full stops. In Maths we have been continuing with our topic of addition and adding two parts to make a whole. In Science this week, we explored our sense of smell and had to smell some very interesting smells!

In Blossom room this week, we have been linking activities to "happy breathing", as part of the My happy mind programme. The children have been having lots of fun as they joined in with the activities. In group sessions we have been talking about how to use our breathing to calm down, the children were able to use the ribbon blowers which they made, breathing in and

out while watching the ribbons rise and fall with each breathe.

Exploring water and bubble mixture, the children have been using whisks, making handfuls of bubbles which they blew at each other. While outside they have been sharing tubes of bubbles, some blowing them while others catch the bubbles.
