Dear Parents & Carers

In Nursery this week, we have been learning about the world and the 7 continents. The children discussed where they have been in the world and where they would like to visit. Some children wanted to go to Spain because it is hot. Other children wanted to go to Australia so that they could meet Koala Bears and some wanted to go to Antarctica to meet penguins!

This week Reception children have continued their new topic 'Big Lights, Big City' which focuses on learning about different types of transport and the different counties in the United Kingdom. This week we have been reading the story 'The Naughty Bus' by Jan Oke and focusing our learning on 'buses'. We have looked at different types of buses, how they travel, how we use them and the children have especially enjoyed talking about the bus journeys that they have been on with their families.

In mathematics we have been learning about Ordinal numbers (1st, 2nd, 3rd). Finally, the children have enjoyed model making again this week but we are running extremely low on junk modelling resources. Please can we have your cereal boxes, clean yogurt pots etc.

Year One have had a fun week painting penguins in Art, pretending to be a kangaroo in English and buzzing around the classroom like a bumblebee in music. In History we have been looking at Bournville in preparation for our trip to Cadbury World next week. The children have blown us away with their effort in the Phonics Screening Test and we are super proud of all of the children for trying their best!

This week in Year 2 we have started our new English book 'Ruby's Wish' We discussed new vocabulary from the story fearless and unfairly. In maths we have been focusing on time, looking at quarter to and quarter past as well as o' clock. In History we learnt about Rosa Parks and Martin Luther King. In PSHE we looked at life cycles and in science we have looked at electricity and how to stay safe.

Blossom News

Whilst dodging the rain this week, in the blossom room the children have continued to explore activities which will help to support their fine motor development, from craft activities, dressing dolls and doing the washing up in our water tray. The children have been using pegs while hanging out the washing and used them in games to create snakes and spiders. We noticed that our raspberries are now growing, so have been checking each day to see if they are beginning to ripen. The children have played many fun board games and completed jigsaw puzzles. We have been learning the rhyme 5 currant buns, which they have enjoyed acting out, counting 1-5 and finding out how many remain when 1 is taken away.
