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Dear Parents & Carers

This week Willow class have had lots of fun celebrating St David's Day, the Hindu festival Holi and World Book Day. We made cupcake daffodils and drew red dragons for St David's Day. We made an absolute mess of ourselves and the playground by throwing powdered paint for Holi and dressed up as our favourite book characters for World Book Day. In maths we have been learning about the number 4 and reading *'Pete the Cat and his Four Groovy Buttons'*.

The children have had another lovely week in Reception! We have been learning about plants and how they grow. We have labelled the features of a sunflower; such as the stem, leaves and roots. The children had a fantastic day on World Book Day and they looked amazing in all of their story book costumes! Just a reminder that PE and Library is on a Thursday this term.

This week in Year One we have been looking at length and height of objects. They really enjoyed finding the shortest and the longest object from outside on the playground. The children are particularly interested in History lessons at the moment; we are really enjoying learning about past Kings and Queens. We had a fabulous day for World Book Day, everybody thoroughly enjoyed the guess the teacher game and working through the World Book Day activities. The children looked amazing in their costumes and pyjamas!



This week in Year 2 has been full of curiosity and brilliant learning. In Maths, the children have been exploring doubling and halving, dividing by 2, and building confidence with the 2 times table. In English, we've been strengthening our writing by using subordination clauses, choosing powerful verbs, and practising the homophones *there* and *their*. Our History lessons have taken us back to the Tudor court as we learned about Henry VIII and his six wives, while in Science we investigated the Earth's rotation and how it creates day and night.

We also had a wonderful time celebrating World Book Day, topped off with an exciting author visit from Jane Cox who inspired lots of budding writers. It's been a fantastic week of learning and imagination.
