Dear Parents & Carers

This week in Willow class we collected leaves to create pictures of animals. We had our first PE lesson in the hall, where we practiced moving in different ways. We also played a game called Shark Attack, where Miss Keane was a shark who tried to get us before we jumped on an island (Hula Hoop). We also had our first tumble time session, where we got to climb over soft play shapes, through tunnels and slide down the large triangles.

Reception classes have had a fantastic first full week of school! We have started learning phonics this week and have learnt the sounds 'm' 'a' 's' 'd'. We have also started maths and have been practicing counting and recognising numbers. We had a visitor this week from 'Leaf' the polar bear who came into the classroom to teach us about how to make friends and exploring our differences.

Year 1 have really enjoyed this week's English work. We have looked at the setting in our story 'Leaf' and used describing words to describe what we can see. The children have settled really well and we are all super proud of them!

This week, Year 2 classes have continued their exciting journey learning about the story 'Leaf'. In English, we put our persuasive writing skills to the test by composing heartfelt letters inspired by Leaf's story. The children showed great empathy and creativity in their arguments! In Art, we got hands-on with nature by creating beautiful leaf prints, exploring textures and patterns while connecting with our theme. In Geography, we became explorers of our own school! We investigated the site and made observations in preparation for drawing detailed maps next week. It's been a week full of creativity, curiosity, and connection - and we can't wait to see what next week brings!
