Dear Parents & Carers

Thank you to everyone who has donated a prize for the tombola ready for the Christmas Fayre next week (Friday 5th December). We have had some very generous donations this year and your support is always very much appreciated. The classes are busy rehearsing for the nativities and next week we are sure pupils will be even more excited when the school is decorated for Christmas and the stage goes up!

We have some fantastic prizes in our Christmas Raffle including a 32" HDTV, Christmas Hamper, Safari Park & Hatton Tickets! Raffle tickets are just 50p each and the draw will take place on Wednesday 17th December.

This week Willow class have been continuing our topic of Hanukkah. We made menorahs out of playdough and counted the candles using a wooden menorah. In PE we experimented with moving in different ways and had a go at wheelbarrow races. In maths we have been looking at the numeral 1.

This week the Reception children have continued to learn about castles! We have discussed who lives in a castle, exploring kings, queens and knights, and their jobs in a castle. In maths we have learnt about positional language such as in-front, behind, next to, on top, etc. The children have been working really hard in the nativity, please help your child practice their lines if they are a narrator. A message will go out soon if your child has a specific role in the play.

Year 1 have had a busy and exciting week of learning. In Maths, the children have been exploring place value and working with teen numbers, while in English they have finished innovating their class story with lots of imagination and creativity. Preparations for Christmas are well underway as the children have been practising their nativity songs with great enthusiasm. In History, they enjoyed learning about the toys their grandparents used to play with, sparking discussions about how play has changed over time. The children were shocked that some toys such as slinkies and hula hoops are still played with today!

Year 2 have enjoyed a busy and engaging week. In science, the children have been learning about food chains and exploring how different animals depend on one another for food. In RE, they have been finding out what Christians believe about Jesus and how they prepare to celebrate his birth at Christmas. In maths, the class has been developing their mastery skills by investigating doubles, and in English they have produced some wonderful stories inspired by 'The Three Wolves and the Big Bad Pig'.

Hello everyone

So far this term 4 families have been issued with a penalty notice for Leave of Absence in term time!

Under the new regulations, the penalty notice for any unauthorised absence is £80 for each child and each parent. For a family of four with two children, that would amount to £320 if paid within 21 days of receiving the penalty notice. If paid between day 22 and 28, it would be £640.

A second offence within a three-year period, the discount of £80 per parent for each child won't apply. For a family of four with two children, that would amount to £640. A third period of unauthorised absence within a three-year period means that the local authority will be unable to issue another penalty notice and may instead refer the matter directly to Court.

If you receive a penalty notice and don't pay it, the law states that the local authority must withdraw the penalty notices and prosecute the parents in court where they could each receive £1000 fine, a parenting order, a criminal record and various costs awarded against them.
