As we embrace the vibrant colours of spring, I'm thrilled to share the wonderful artistic journey our pupils have embarked upon this half term. Our focus on Art has brought a splash of creativity and joy to every corner of our school.

Our Reception children have been on a sensory adventure, exploring paint in myriad ways. Their little fingers have danced across paper, creating masterpieces that capture their

innate creativity. Music has been a source of inspiration, with our youngest artists expressing their feelings through colour as melodies filled the air. The celebration of Chinese New Year saw the creation of clay snakes, while lessons on love and kindness resulted in beautiful heart sun catchers. It's been heartwarming to witness their enthusiasm and growing skills.





Year 1 pupils have delved into the world of sculpture and 3D paper play. They've shown remarkable dexterity in rolling paper tubes and securing

them to bases, making thoughtful choices about arrangement and colour. Their Paper Strip Sculptures have transformed flat surfaces into captivating 3D drawings. The pièce de résistance

has been their 'tree of life' sculptures, showcasing a variety of paper-shaping techniques. It's been



particularly pleasing to see their collaborative skills blossom as they worked together on these projects.



Our Year 2 artists have been mixing it up with painting and mixed media. They've become quite the colour theorists, confidently naming primary and secondary colours and making predictions about colour

mixing outcomes. Their keen eyes have been put to the test as they described colours and textures in detail. The exploration of texture has been fascinating, with pupils experimenting with different tools to recreate surfaces and deciding which worked best. Their ability to identify various textures in collaged artwork demonstrates their growing artistic awareness.



As I walk through our corridors, I'm constantly amazed by the explosion of creativity on display. From finger-painted masterpieces to intricate paper sculptures and textured mixed media works, the artistic growth of our pupils is evident at every turn.

This focus on Art has not only developed new skills but has also fostered self-expression, problem-solving, and teamwork. It's a joy to see our pupils so engaged and proud of their creations. As we move forward, I'm excited to see how these experiences will continue to shape their learning and development across all areas of the curriculum.

Our Reception and Year 2 pupils have shown remarkable improvement since the Autumn Term. Year 2's attendance now stands at an impressive 95%, with Reception close behind at 94.6%. We're particularly keen to support our Year 1 pupils in boosting their attendance from the current 89.3%.
