SEND Strategy

The new 2025 – 2028 SEND Strategy – that "Milton Keynes is a place where children and young people with SEND thrive, belong and are at the heart of our plans" has been published on our **Local Offer** and the programme of work to deliver towards this strategy has begun.

Our first action meetings for the new strategy have taken place this month, and we look forward to sharing more about progress as the year goes on.

Understanding and Navigating School Avoidance

The EBSA Working Group has developed free guidance and resources to support parents and carers in understanding EBSA. These tools aim to help you feel more confident in promoting your child's emotional wellbeing and engagement with learning.

The guidance includes practical strategies and resources, supportive advice and signposting to local services. Whether you're just noticing signs or already dealing with EBSA, these resources are here to support you and your child.


Take a look at this sample from the Practical Resource Pack - it illustrates how the strategies can be applied.

Emotion check-ins

Children can find it hard to communicate what they are feeling and why. They might not know what they are feeling, might have difficulties finding the right words or might feel embarrassed to say it out loud.

It is likely that your child's school has a range of visual emotion communication resources that they use in school. For example, they might use the Zones of Regulation curriculum, the Incredible 5-point Scale or Communicate in Print resources. Ask the SENCo to share the key resources they use in school so that you can use them at home as well. You might also be able to share ideas for how to personalise these resources, based on your child's interests.

School Transport update for parents

Following the October half term, payments for Family Led Travel Budgets (FLTBs) and Mileage will now be uploaded to a Direct Payment Card. The card can be used for School/College travel related expenses and can be used online, at a petrol station, also for bank transfers. This card offers greater flexibility and helps keep school travel expenses separate from your personal bank account.

Many families will have received their card already but if not, it should be with you by the end of this week. Payments will be uploaded by 30 October for expenses across the rest of the rest of this autumn term.
