

Jewellery Policy



The Governors of Pittington Primary School consider that wearing any type of jewellery, including earrings, is a danger to the health and safety of children in school. This danger includes those children wearing jewellery but also to those who could be injured as a result.

The governors recognise that parents/carers may wish to allow their children to have their ears pierced and are therefore willing, over a short period of time for healing purposes, to allow those children to wear studs.

However the parent/carer must inform the school in writing and understand that the six to eight week healing period must be adhered to. Any further need to wear studs must be discussed with the Head Teacher.

Whilst the ears are healing, children are unable to take part in any swimming or physical education activities.

Children are able to wear a watch or an activity tracker for school. However, devices which have the capability to communicate via text or telephone, even if not enabled, are not allowed in school.

Devices which have the capability to take a photograph, or send photographs to other SIM devices, even if not enabled, are not allowed in school.

No other jewellery must be worn for school.
