## **Key Reminders**

#### • School times:

Gates open from **8.35am** to **8.45am**. Please ensure your child attends punctually. Pick up is **3.10pm**.

#### • Drop Off/Pick Up:

This is inevitably a busy time (albeit for a small period of time) – please park respectfully of our neighbours, avoiding driveways and garages. Please ensure our Zig Zag markings remain clear.

#### Snacks

Fruit is provided in KS1 pupils only. Remember it is a healthy snack that needs to be sent in for KS2 pupils please. Named/identifiable water bottles should be in school every day.

- **Label Everything!** This is so important to avoid things going missing. Any parent is able to come and look through lost property and therefore it is important that all items are labelled.
- **Welly boots** As we go into the Autumn term, the field will no doubt get soggier. If you can provide a pair of welly boots for these months, it means more spaces can remain accessible.







### **Attendance & Punctuality**

Target: 96%+ for every child.

If your child is unwell, please call the office by 9am to report the absence.

#### **Government Update on Absence**

The Department for Education has introduced a national attendance framework. Schools are now required to consider a penalty notice (fine) if a pupil has 10 sessions of absence within a 10-week period. Each school day is split into two sessions (morning and afternoon), so this equates to five full days of absence. You can track your child's attendance in the Arbor parent app.

A penalty notice may be issued if children are absent in the following circumstances:

- Holiday taken without permission
- Where the reason for absence is not provided
- When the absence is unauthorized
- When a pupil arrives after the register has closed

Only absences due to exceptional circumstances can be authorized.

If you know your child will be absent, please complete an Absence Request form from the school office — even if you suspect the absence will not meet the criteria for authorisation. We will always look more favourably on families who are open and honest with us about planned absences, rather than taking a less transparent approach.



### **School Trips and Visits**

Enriching the curriculum through trips and visits is an important part of our children's education. Although we endeavour to always support families facing financial difficulties, unfortunately we cannot fund these activities for all alone. Last year, the PTFA kindly donated money towards travel costs so we can ask for a smaller voluntary contribution from parents. Thank you for your continued support with this. As always, we are always happy to talk and offer support where we can.



### **Celebration Assembly**

Every Friday morning from 9 -9.25am (Aprox) we hold our weekly celebration assembly. This is a time for teachers to celebrate their class's achievements. Your child will be selected for a leaf award, a kindness award or Mrs Collins' Head Teacher award. Miss Shoemark will contact you to invite you to attend (Hopefully by the Thursday morning). We know this is short notice but hope you appreciate we want to give the instantaneous feedback for their learning that week. We would like children to look smart in school and to wear the correct school uniform. This contributes to a sense of belonging and is in keeping with a purposeful and respectful learning environment. This is something we would really like to raise expectations of again in the new year.

#### **School Uniform**

- Checked school skirt
- Smart school grey trousers (no leggings/tracksuit bottoms)
- School jumper with logo
- Grey tights or plain grey/navy/white socks
- White revere collar blouses
- White shirt with school tie
- School shoes should be plain and black
- Long hair should be tied back with navy/dark and plain hair bands
   (jewellery and fancy/oversized coloured hair bands should be saved for non-uniform days and home. Small stud earrings are permitted)

In the summer term, navy blue Gingham school dresses or grey school shorts (not combat) can be worn.

#### **PE Uniform**

- a school PE sports top with the school logo or plain navy polo shirt
- Plain navy/black mid-length shorts, skort or navy/black leggings
- During the colder months, the children may wear plain, navy/black track suits.
- sports trainers or plimsols
