Health and Well-being

Over the half-term, pupils in Y3 and 4 will be taking part in a six-week "Amber Valley Health & Wellbeing Education Programme", designed to help children learn about the importance of being active for 60 minutes every day and making healthy food choices to support their wellbeing.

The Chief Medical Officer recommends that children and young people are active for at least 60 minutes every day, which can include walking, dancing, playground games, cycling, or anything that gets the body moving.

Over the six weeks, pupils will take part in a series of fun, engaging sessions that encourage:

- Daily movement through games, challenges, and active breaks
- Learning about the different food groups and how to build a balanced plate
- Learning more about how our bodies work and how to look after ourselves
- Understanding how physical activity supports concentration, mood, and energy
- Setting simple goals to stay active at school and at home

The sessions will take place during the school day, led by Amber Valley School Sport Partnership staff.

At the end of the six weeks, pupils will celebrate their achievements and receive an "Amber Valley Health & Wellbeing Education Programme Champion" certificate.

To support the programme at home, please try to:

- Encourage your child to talk about what they've learned.
- Try some of the simple home challenges they bring back each week.

 Be active together — small changes (like walking to school or dancing to music) all count
