

When Jesus appeared to his apostles in Jerusalem after he had risen from the dead, what did he want to tell them? What were his last words and what was he anxious for the apostles to understand? He

wanted them to know that he had kept his promise and the tomb was empty. He knew how disheartened they must have been feeling following the events of the Passover weekend. He was eager that they should not lose heart and should be courageous about preaching the message he had taught for the past three years. What is this message?

You could be forgiven for thinking that it was about maintaining his reputation. Make sure that everyone knows I worked all those miracles? Work hard so that the world will remember me as a great religious leader? Start a Church and get people to worship God? In fact, it was none of these things. These were the last words of Jesus: *"So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations beginning from Jerusalem."*

The whole purpose of Jesus' life, death and resurrection was that men and women can be part of God's life; that no matter how much we might stray from God we will never be abandoned; that God constantly offers us the chance to return to him; that because Christ took on death and sin and proved victorious we can enjoy the prospect of life at its deepest level. Forgiveness of sins. That's what he wanted them to grasp. That's what he wanted them to preach. That's what the resurrection was for. **The empty tomb was no empty promise**.
