To an atheist, Christian hope must seem strange. A new heaven and a new earth has no scientific basis. Indeed it can't have. At present, all that science can ultimately foresee is a frozen waste of nothingness. The prospect of blissful eternal life has no basis other than in the word of God.

Today's 2nd Reading exhorts us to defend that hope. We can do that by showing how God has kept his promises historically and by showing that his promises continue to be fulfilled today.

Historically, God promised the seemingly impossible only to fulfil it: Abraham and Sarah in advanced age beget a son, down-trodden Hebrews gain freedom from their slave-masters, an eagerly awaited Messiah comes, but in the most unexpected manner. Killed, defeated, he rises from death to fulfil his mission.

Today, God's promises continue to be fulfilled. God continues to bless us with new life, with freedom from slavery to sin, with the promise and hope of resurrection.

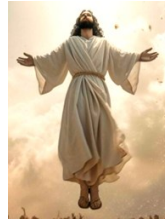
Yet, perhaps there is one other way to defend that hope: by allowing it to put pep in our step...

National Day of Prayer for Survivors of Abuse

The **National Day of Prayer for Survivors of Abuse** takes place every year on the fifth Tuesday of Easter. In 2026, the day is marked on **Tuesday, 5 May**. The theme is *Jesus said, "I came that they may have life and have it abundantly."* (John 10:10)

This year we look at the scourge of domestic abuse which causes pain and fear that prevent its victims from living the life Jesus came to bring. Immediately before the much-loved part of this verse from the Gospel of John, we hear Jesus's words: "The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy."

This is how abuse feels to those who experience it – their dignity and value as a unique child of God is stripped away and destroyed.

The physical danger domestic abuse presents to life is clear. A woman is murdered by a partner or ex-partner every five days in the UK. Between three and 10 women die by suicide each week due to domestic abuse. Abusers can also perpetrate spiritual and coercive abuse, disrupting their victims' relationships with God and the Church. This can lead victims – adults and children – to feel guilt and shame that push them away from the support that the Church has to offer.

At its best, the Church can – and should – be a safe haven where support is available for victims and survivors so that they can live life without fear and begin to experience the life in abundance Jesus came to bring.
