Are there any precious items in your family that have been handed down from one generation to the next? Whether jewellery, ornaments, silverware, books, or old photos or letters, most families have certain items that are guarded carefully and kept in a safe place to be passed on to future generations. Likewise, we have stories that are passed on from parents and grandparents, which form part of our history and our sense of who we are. Today we think about another type of precious gift which must be guarded carefully — *our faith*, and the teachings of Jesus. In today's Second Reading, Paul reminds us that we have been 'trusted to look after something precious'. How often do we think of our faith as something 'precious'? What does our faith mean to us? 
