Year 3 Cricket Competition

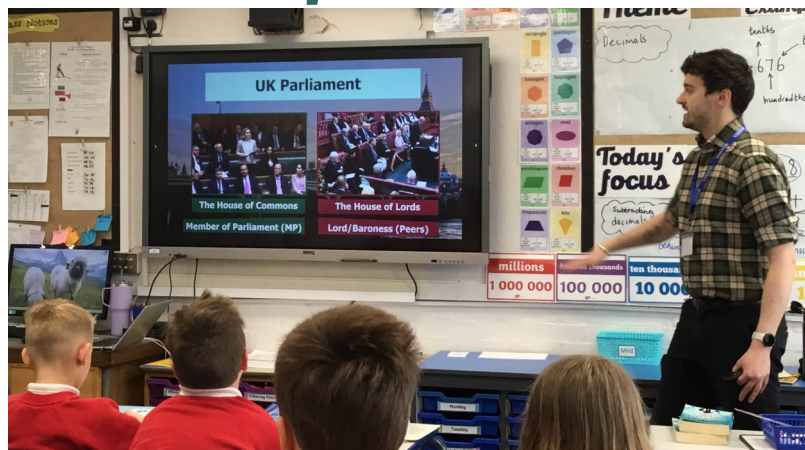

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are delighted to introduce an exciting new musical opportunity for young performers: the *Elevate Primary School Orchestra*. This initiative is designed to enrich pupils' musical experiences and provide a rewarding environment for ensemble playing.

The orchestra will begin after half term and will run for an initial block of six sessions, starting on **Wednesday 3rd June 2026**. Rehearsals will take place weekly at **Carlton Miniott Primary School from 3:45pm to 4:45pm**.



Who can take part?

This opportunity is free and open to children who already play a string, woodwind or brass musical instrument, and have some experience reading musical notation. Participating in an ensemble is a valuable next step in developing musicianship, confidence, and teamwork. Percussion spaces are available however limited. As part of our repertoire planning, we are currently gathering information about pupils who receive instrumental tuition, either through peripatetic teachers or external providers.

Practical arrangements

- **Transport:** Parents and carers are responsible for arranging transport to and from the venue.
- **What to bring:** Children should bring their instrument, along with a drink and a light snack.
- **Parental supervision:** Parents and carers are welcome to either drop off and collect their child or remain in the hall during the session if they wish to observe or support. We kindly ask that mobile phones are only used outside the school building.

We understand that travel arrangements may occasionally result in slight delays; please be assured that this will not be an issue.

Performances

As the orchestra develops, there will be numerous performance opportunities. These will allow families to see the progress made and celebrate the children's musical achievements.
