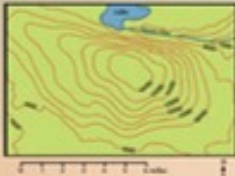

Height in metres (m) above sea level

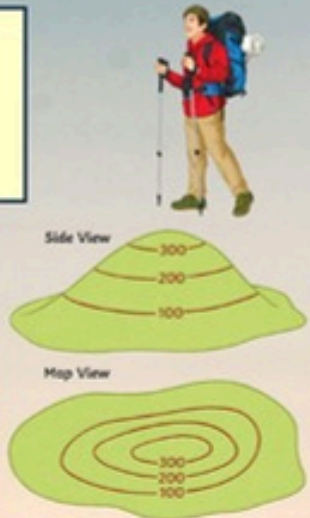

Year 6 Have Been Learning About...  
**MOUNTAINS**

In our geography work, we have been learning about maps and how hills and mountains are shown through the use of contour lines. Contour lines are lines on a map which join up places of the same height.

So, we decided to make some mountains of our own showing how relief can be shown through contour lines.



First of all, we raided the recycling bins to reuse cardboard and shape our hills



We then started to glue our layers together to form different peaks. We even had valleys and rivers. We painted our mountains showing different heights and elevations by using a different colour for the changing height.
