End of Year Reports 2025-26

Dear Parents and Carers,

You will receive your child's end of year report for 2025-26 by email later today. I hope you find the format user-friendly and that the report gives you an accurate reflection of the progress your child has made this year, as well as some next steps to focus on. In addition, depending on what year group your child is, you may receive some further information relating to statutory assessments.

Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)

The report shows your child's progress towards the 17 Early Learning Goals (ELGs), by which every child leaving the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) is assessed. These are based on typical child development at the age of 5.

The ELGs suggest the level of development children are generally '**expected**' to have attained by the end of the EYFS. Children may still be at the '**emerging**' level of development on a particular goal. This may be because they are born late in the academic year, are late developers or missed a considerable amount of the reception year. For others this may be because they have a special educational need or a disability. You will be emailed a descriptor of each goal in addition to your child's report.

This information on your child's learning and development in the EYFS will be used to support a successful transition for them into Key Stage 1.

Year 1 Phonics test/ Year 2 Phonics re-test

You will receive a sheet informing you about how we conduct the check as well as the score out of 40 that your child achieved. A score of 31 or more is above the threshold and therefore means a child has 'Met the expected standard in phonic decoding'. Year 1 children scoring less than 31 out of 40 will be re-tested when they are in Year 2. Any current Year 2 who did not meet the threshold in Year 1 will have a sheet to inform you of the score out of 40 that your child achieved in their re-test.

Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check

You will receive an additional data sheet, with information about the check, showing your child's score out of 25.

KS2/Year 6 Results

You will receive a results sheet by email. In Reading, Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling and in Mathematics the scores range from 80 -120 scaled score. A scaled score of 100+ will determine if your child is 'Working at the expected standard'. A scaled score of 110-120 equates to 'Working at greater depth within the expected standard'. Please note that, in Writing

and Science, the level is a teacher assessment and not based on a standardised test. Year 6 reports and results will be emailed on Monday due to the delay in publishing SATs data this year.
