Pupils will learn about how shops in our local area have changed and developed over time. They will use historical sources to look at rationing and food packaging.

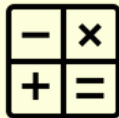

Curriculum questions to ask at home



1. Where is Kenya located?

Answer: Kenya is a country in East Africa.

2. What is the capital city of Kenya?

Answer: The capital city of Kenya is Nairobi.

3. What is the name of a famous wildlife reserve in Kenya where many animals live?

Answer: The Maasai Mara National Reserve.

4. What is the weather like in Kenya compared to the UK?

Answer: Kenya is usually warmer and sunnier than the UK.

5. Name one animal that lives in Kenya.

Answer: A giraffe lives in Kenya. (Other examples: lion, elephant, zebra)

6. What do animals need to survive?

Answer: Animals need food, water, air and shelter to survive.

7. What do humans need to stay healthy?

Answer: Humans need good food, water, exercise and sleep.

8. Which part of the human body is used for thinking?

Answer: The brain is used for thinking.

9. In the past, how did people in Bury buy food and goods?

Answer: People shopped at local markets and small shops.

10. How do many people shop today compared to the past?

Answer: Many people shop in supermarkets and online today.

11. What is the name of the well-known shopping place in Bury?
