At Peel Brow, we are committed to creating a safe, happy and nurturing environment where every child can thrive.

To help us achieve this, we have clear policies and procedures in place that support positive behaviour and ensure the well-being of every pupil.

Our whole-school rules — Be Ready, Be Respectful, Be Safe — are at the heart of everything we do and are consistently taught, modelled and displayed in every classroom and shared area across school. We recognise that every child is unique, and at times some children may need additional help to meet our expectations.

One of the ways we do this is through our Reflection Club, held at lunchtime. Children may be asked to attend if they need time to think about their choices, talk through what happened, and plan how to make a better choice next time. Please continue to encourage your child to Be Ready, Be Respectful and Be Safe not only in school, but also at

home, in the community and when online.

Attendance

As part of our attendance monitoring to ensure all children are in school on time, the school gates will open from 8.30am. Please note if your children are arriving through the office, they are missing learning. If they arrive after 9.00am they have an Unauthorised Absence mark.

Regular attendance in primary school is essential for a child's academic, social, and emotional development. It ensures that children build foundational skills in literacy and numeracy, engage in structured learning, and develop positive habits like punctuality and responsibility. When children miss school frequently, they can fall behind in their learning, struggle to keep up with peers, and experience lower self-confidence. Informing parents about the importance of attendance helps them understand their role in supporting consistent school participation and encourages early intervention if issues arise. Strong attendance habits in primary years lay the groundwork for future educational success.
