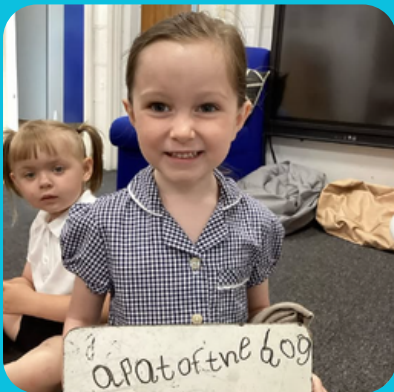

## What's been going on in school this week?

In the Hive, children were delighted to explore their redesigned outdoor area for the first time, making the most of the fantastic new equipment. The swing and sensory garden proved particularly popular, providing exciting opportunities for play, exploration and sensory development. In Ducklings, pupils have continued to make accelerated progress in their sentence writing and number skills, with learning linked closely to their engaging seaside topic. Robins have been busy learning about time and revising their knowledge of shapes in Maths, while in Science they have been exploring the fascinating wildlife of the Arctic and Antarctic. In Kingfishers, pupils have combined their history and art learning by designing Roman gods and bringing their creations to life using clay. They have also written detailed recounts about Julius Caesar in English and developed their understanding of symmetry in maths. In Falcons, Year 6 pupils enjoyed some memorable end-of-year enrichment activities, including a walk to the top of Peel Tower and a Forest School session at the Orchard. Falcons class also took part in a motivational workshop delivered by the One Message Youth Service, which focused on crime prevention and the importance of understanding the consequences of our actions.

## SAFEGUARDING UPDATE: Holiday Recreation

As the summer holidays approach, many children will be spending more time online, whether gaming, watching videos or chatting with friends. Regular conversations about online safety can help children make positive choices and stay safe when using technology. Reminding children not to share personal information, to be kind and respectful online, and to speak to a trusted adult if they see or experience anything that makes them feel uncomfortable can help ensure that their online experiences remain safe and enjoyable.

It is also important to encourage a healthy balance between screen time and other activities. Spending time outdoors, being physically active, playing games, reading, pursuing hobbies and enjoying face-to-face conversations with family and friends can all support children's wellbeing and development. Taking an interest in the apps, games and websites children use, while setting sensible boundaries around device use, is one of the most effective ways to help children develop safe and healthy digital habits.
