#### Literacy in Nursery

The children will enjoy listening to a wide range of stories, songs and rhymes linked to the topic. The story sessions will often include the use of a wide range of puppets and story sacks to help stimulate interest and enthusiasm. All children will choose their own library book each week to take home and enjoy with parents. They will also take home the Nursery Rhyme of the week to add to their Nursery Rhyme booklet. There will also be lots of opportunities to 'play write' especially in the home corner. The children will be taught to 'Nip, Flip & Grip' a pencil to develop their pencil grip.

A wide range of drawing and writing materials are always available on the drawing trolley. We will continue to develop our fine motor skills through lots of activities egusing play dough, mark making, painting, threading, using tweezers and tracing.





again these will often be supported by the use of visual aids such as puppets and pictures. They will practise counting through lots of fun games and activities. They will also be learning colours, shapes and sorting and matching objects.

### You can help your child by

- Talking with them as much as you can about anything and everything.
- Sharing books together
- Counting objects around the home.
- Looking at and naming shapes and colours around the home and when you are out and about.
- Practising putting on own coats and fastening buttons and zips at home to make your child more independent.
- Encouraging your child to be as independent as possible when using the toilet and washing hands.
