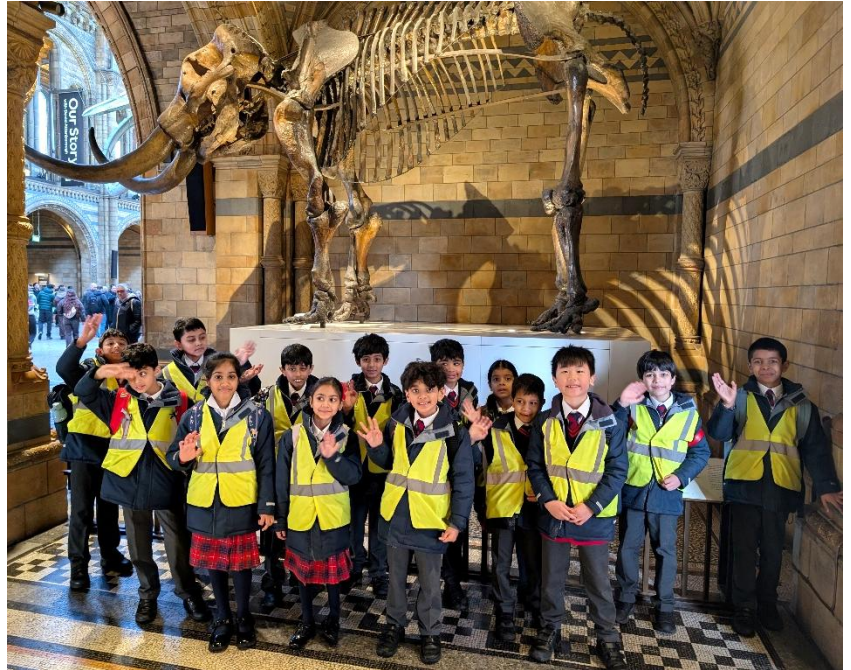


EXPLORING HISTORY!

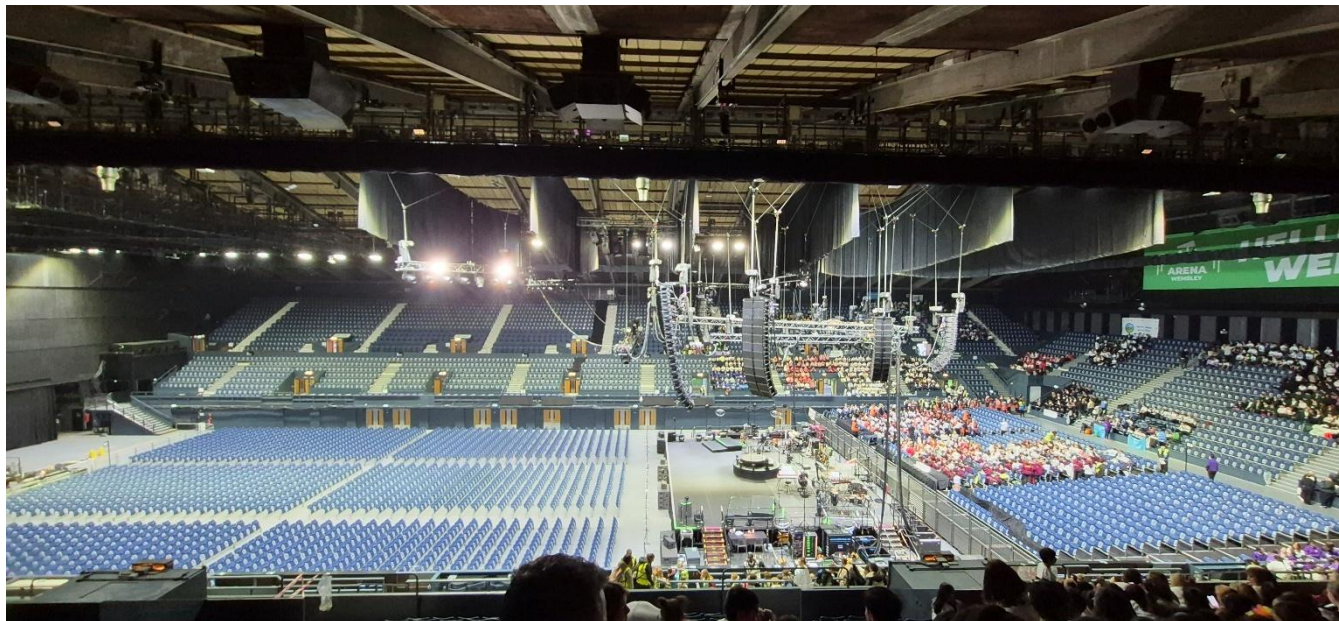

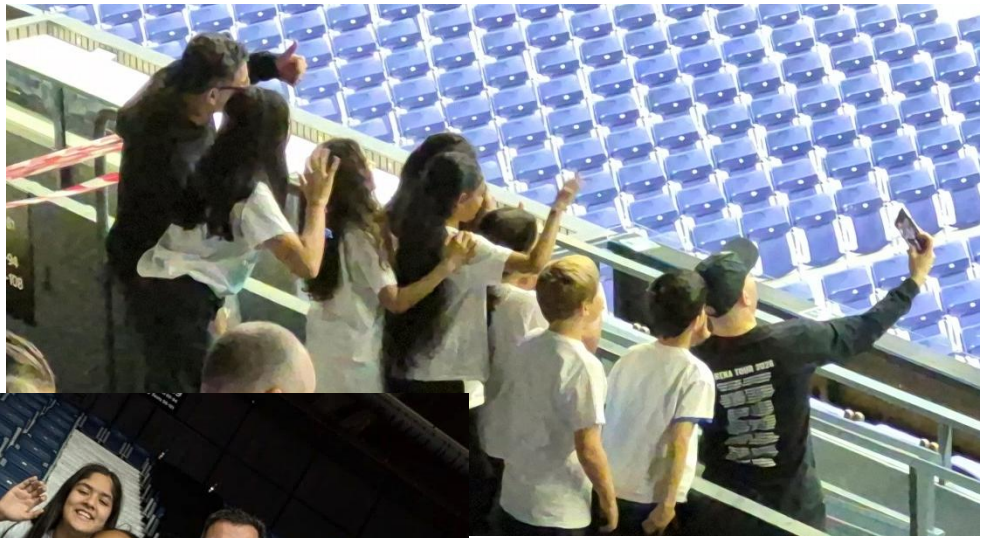




YOUNG VOICES
