Mansvi (Year 5) Writes...



In 1908, their dreams culminated in the establishment of the Kensington Gurdwara in the heart of London, becoming the first Gurdwara in Europe. The Gurdwara stands as a testament to the enduring spirit of Sikh Gurus. It serves as a sanctuary for Sikhs and a welcoming and serene place for all seekers of spirituality and divine knowledge. The children in Year 4 explored what it was like to be a Sikh and enjoyed a delicious homemade meal with members of the Sikh community.
