WHAT WE HAVE BEEN LEARNING ABOUT THIS WEEK

CUBA	This week in Cuba class we have been exploring space, the class made moon dough and really enjoyed moulding it, smelling it and touching it. We have made marks in moon dust using tractors. brushes, rollers and our fingers. The children have really enjoyed listening to the story "Whatever Next". I think the highlight of the week for the class was exploring our new space rocket set. They enjoyed pressing the button to hear it count down for take-off.
HAWAII	This week, Hawaii class continued their understanding of what life was like as an evacuee. In pairs, the children made bomb shelters and played games in them such as noughts and crosses. We also listened to the air raid siren and thought about how the children might have been feeling if they heard it. We also have started creating out own podcasts using the laptops. The children have learnt to record, edit and playback their recording and will use this to plan their podcast.
ANTIGUA / ST LUCIA	This week in early years we have been learning all about space. We have had a very busy crafting week. We pretending we were astronauts landing on the moon and made paper plate aliens. We have also made our own planets and used marbles to make moon craters in flour.
NEW ZEALAND	This week we got fully submerged in our new topic 'Sparks and Flames.' We sang 'London's Burning' and discovered The Great Fire of London. We created a timeline to show the order of events and looked at historical sources. In English, we had a visit from a naughty book eating monster! We are now thinking about how to make a trap to catch him! Have you seen him? In maths, we are looking at 1 more and 1 less. We have had fun with basketball in PE and are getting much better with our ball control.
GALAPAGOS	This week in Galapagos class we have continued to explore our WW2 topic further, we learnt all about the Battle of Britain, made our own timelines and then had a go at making our own spitfire models! In English our focus is still on evacuation, we had our questions sent to a lady that was evacuated in WW2 and she sent us a video explaining what it was like, it was very interesting! We have then began discussing writing a persuasive letter, imagining we are the British government trying to persuade parents to evacuate their children to safer places. We have explored persuasive techniques like emotive language and rhetorical questions. In art we created our own mood boards to match the primary colour wheel, the children loved searching for blue, yellow and red items all around the school. Have a great weekend!
JAMAICA	This week in Jamaica class, we have looked at the importance of exercise for the heart. We studied the different parts of the heart, and recognised the different ways that we can keep our heart healthy. On Tuesday, the year 5 children arrived at school at 6am ready for our trip to the Natural History Museum in London. We studied the different artefacts and explored the different areas in the museum. We found an area which linked directly to our science topic: animals including humans. We looked at the bone structures of different mammals and found a detailed replica of the human body.







Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance are Changing.

As set down by the Department for Education, penalty notices can be issued for unauthorised absence. With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024.

Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines will now be issued to each parent, for each child that was absent.

For example:

3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

5 consecutive days of term time leave

Penalty Notice Fines will be issued for Term Time Leave of 5 or more consecutive days. INSET training days are school days and can be included in the 5 or more consecutive days where there was intent to be absent for term time leave.

10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period.

1 First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

2 Second Offence

Within 3 years

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

3 Third Offence

And Any Further Offence (Within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate, due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.
