

WHAT WE HAVE BEEN LEARNING ABUT THIS WEEK				
BAHAMAS	In Cuba and Bahamas this week we have enjoyed listening to and exploring the characters from The Three Little Pigs. In science we built houses for the pigs and explored wet and dry sand. In Maths we have explored big and little, ordering them by size. We have enjoyed mark making ir			
CUBA	shaving foam and using white boards. We have introduced and the children have explored using choice boards for snack. We have also really enjoyed our messy play, especially making moon dough.			
HAWAII	This week in Hawaii Class, the children have been writing a letter from the rainforest to a friend. They have been writing as if they were a macaw who has experienced forest fires and poaching. The children have used amazing descriptive words to explain how the macaw is feeling in the letter. The children have also compared the Amazon Rainforest to Sherwood forest by acting out how they would react to different things they would see when they are there such as monkeys, crocodiles and foxes.			
ANTIGUA	"Doesn't he know? There's no such thing as a Gruffalo!" This week in Antigua we have been looking at "The Gruffalo". This involved getting to know the story's characters as we ventured through our Gruffalo sensory tray, greeting a mouse, fox, owl, snake and Gruffalo along the way! We have also been making paper chain snakes, colour mixing, painting and developing our fine motor skills with a playdough disco! We have also been exploring a range of mathematical concepts. The children made a repeating pattern, ordered according to size, explored "long" and "short" lengths and went on a super number and shape hunt!			
ST LUCIA	This week in St Lucia our book focus has been The Three Little Pigs! We have had lots of fun making pigs and wolves to retell the story. We made houses for the pigs and discussed which one we would rather live in, hay, sticks or bricks! We had a go at blowing them down too! This week in phonics we have started writing in our books, i am so proud of how well the children have done with their writing so far! In maths this week we have been exploring repeating patterns, we made a pattern brick, stick, brick, stick! We were also comparing size, mass and capacity by finding items round the classroom that were heavy and light, and which bucket could hold the most straw to build the Three Little Pigs house.			
MALDIVES	This week in year one the children received a letter from Mummy Pig asking for help with her three little pigs. The children will now learn the skills and knowledge needed to reply to Mummy Pig. In maths, we have been looking at part whole models and the children have used these as additions. In geography, the children looked at hot and cold places and extreme weather. In science, we looked at the recycling process and which items we could recycle. Well done everybody!			
NEW ZEALAND	This week in New Zealand class, we have had a super busy week! The children have been amazing learning all about our new story focus 'Into the Woods' and have been using fantastic vocabulary to describe parts of the story. They then used their golfing skills and were seeing how far they could get the ball and then checking the screens to see their score. The children were really great at this and had some super impressive skills. Finally, we spoke about space week and watched a rocket launching into space. We then had a discussion about whether we think aliens exist or not and how we think they would survive if they were real. To finish it off we then created our own aliens of all shapes, sizes and colours.			
MALTA	This week Malta class has been very busy and worked really hard. In English we have started to learn about writing persuasive letters and have had a go at using persuasive techniques in a range of contexts such as a debate. In Science we explored magnetic poles and investigated which poles attract and which poles repel. In Topic we made our very own Stonehenge models out of clay after learning about prehistoric temples and tombs, I am so impressed with how they turned out and how much pride the children took in their work. Finally we have started our gymnastics unit in PE which the children have thoroughly enjoyed.			

GALAPAGOS	This week in Galapagos class we have been celebrating World Space Week where we thought of questions we would ask an astronaut and then watched an interview with Tim Peake. We learnt how to go to the toilet in space. You must turn the fan on! We then carried out our own investigations launching paper rockets from a straw. We explored the impact the straw length has on how far the rocket flew. In English, Year 4 impressed me with their knowledge of Amy Johnson who is the most famous British pilot. She was the first person to fly solo to Australia and will be the hero in our adventure stories. Finally, we became weather reporters and presented to the class what the weather in the Tropics will be.	
ICELAND	We have had an amazing week this week! We have explored different emotions and characters to write non chronological reports for our crayon characters. We have done some mind boggling mental problems in maths and learned about metamorphosis in science. As part of science week, we also attended Summerfield Primary School to take part in the science dome where we learned all about space!	
JAMAICA	This week in Jamaica has been a rollercoaster of fun. In maths we have had some challenging equations learning how to do long division via bus stop method. I can definitely say, as a fact, long division is complex. Next up is English. We have had to be preparing to write a report load with information on a country of choice! (in the Americas.) In science, we predicted what microorganisms meant by splitting up the word into micro and organism. We had lots of fun finding out that there's hundreds of thousands all around. 



What is the Short Breaks programme?

With the support of local businesses, the Isle of Wight Council's Short Breaks team has curated lots of fun activities specifically for young people on the Isle of Wight, with disabilities and/or additional needs. If you want to participate and are eligible (see below) - you will need to complete a simple form to take part.

Can I do Short Breaks activities?

If you answer 'yes' to the following you are eligible to join in Short Breaks activities.

- I am eighteen years old or younger.
- I have a disability and/or additional need that means I need support to join in leisure and recreational activities.
- I live on the lovely Isle of Wight and/or go to school here.

Are there any other benefits?

Yes, if you are eligible for Short Breaks, you and your family can also use the caravan at Shanklin, which is equipped for people with disabilities. Find out more on page twenty.



Sounds fab! How do I join?

It's simple and free to join*. Visit iow.gov.uk/shortbreaks to complete an application form. You will also need to provide a passport size photograph.





Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance are Changing.

As set down by the Department for Education, penalty notices can be issued for unauthorised absence. With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024.

Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines will now be issued to each parent, for each child that was absent.

For example:

3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

5 consecutive days of term time leave

Penalty Notice Fines will be issued for Term Time Leave of 5 or more consecutive days. INSET training days are school days and can be included in the 5 or more consecutive days where there was intent to be absent for term time leave.

10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period.

1 First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

2 Second Offence

Within 3 years

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

3 Third Offence

And Any Further Offence (Within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate, due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.


