On Tuesday, we had a special visitor from the RNLI who taught us lots of interesting facts about staying safe on our island. In maths we have been looking at arrays and doubles and in science we have looked at the weather across the four seasons. We continue to work hard on improving our reading and our phonics consolidation is going well.
