WHAT WE HAVE BEEN LEARNING ABUT THIS WEEK				
BAHAMAS	This week in Cuba and Bahamas we held a Macmillan coffee session for our grown-up's. We decorated cakes ready for this using icing and sprinkles. We even tried one of our own cakes at snack time. They were super yummy!

HAWAII	This week in Hawaii Class, we have learnt about the layers of the rainforest and used actions to remember emergent, canopy, understory and forest floor. In PE we have been moving in different ways. The children chose to jog, sprint, crawl and pull themselves along.			
ANTIGUA	This week in Antigua we've continued to look at our story, Goldilocks and the Three Bears! We have explored this through lots of fun activities! The children ventured to our role-play kitchen to bake some porridge for daddy bear, mummy bear and baby bear. Baby bear said it was delicious! We have also been exploring opposite concepts such as "soft" and "hard" materials to make baby bear's bed, "hot" and "cold" porridge as well as "big" and "small" chairs. The children have been singing our "Teddy Bear, Teddy Bear, turn around" rhyme, boogying to wake-up shake-up and joining in with Goldilocks yoga.			
ST LUCIA	This week in St Lucia we have started our topic of bears! The children have loved the stories such as Goldilocks and the 3 bears and We're going on a bear hunt! We have used potatoes to print bear footprints, made keep out signs for baby bears bedroom, bear themed yoga and much more! We also loved decorating our cakes for the MacMillan coffee afternoon, we loved eating them too!			
MALDIVES	Wow what a week! The children have been amazing and I felt incredibly proud on our school trip. Each and every one of them was impeccably behaved and a real credit to our wonderful school, very proud teacher moment. We did get a little wet and soggy but had lots of fun through the rainbows and showers. In maths, we have been looking at comparing numbers and saying which is greater than and which is less than. In English, we have started retelling The Three Little Pigs.			
NEW ZEALAND	This week has just flown by in New Zealand – they do say time flies when you're having fun and that's exactly what we've been doing in Year 2! In Maths we have been looking at greater than, less than and equal to, exploring who has more or less. In English we have begun our learning journey to write a narrative on Supertato. We had a go at acting out the story which was great fun and helped us become more familiar with what happens in the book. We have learnt new vocabulary including 'hero' and 'villain' and been able to use these correctly in a sentence. In science we looked the suitability of different materials for different uses based on their properties. We explored why saucepans are made from metal and not plastic and why our coats and wellies are made from waterproof fabric. In Geography we have continued our learning about continents and oceans by mapping out a journey line crossing over different continents and oceans. However, the highlight of our week has to be our fantastic trip to Blackgang Chine!			

MALTA	This week Malta have enjoyed continuing to explore the Stone Age. We have learnt all about the role of archaeologists and how they have helped to discover and investigate evidence found from the Stone Age to help us understand what their lives were like all those years ago. We particularly enjoyed looking the Skara Brae on google maps and having a look at the remains of old Stone Age houses. In science we looked at what makes materials magnetic and non- magnetic and in groups sorted a variety of materials into these categories. We used magnets to test the materials which the children thoroughly enjoyed. In English we have been looking at a range of non-chronological reports and picked out the features from that genre of writing. The children had a go at writing their own headings and subheading for different texts and came up with some great ideas.
GALAPAGOS	It has been another busy week in Galapagos class and already half way through the term. We have made good progress in music, learning to play the 'toot's instruments. We have used classification keys to search for invertebrates. The class loved this so much they have been out at playtimes collecting the largest spiders and bugs they can find! We have published our non-chronological reports on dinosaurs and now starting to look at writing a letter to our future selves. Yesterday we had great fun designing and decorating biscuits for the Macmillan afternoon tea. Thank you to all those who joined us.
ICELAND	We have had a very busy week in year 5. We performed some drama to prepare us to write our persuasive letters. In maths we have been learning how to compare numbers to 1M using concrete resources and in guided reading we have been learning all about dragons. Symbols were the topic of conversation in Geography in relation to maps and the life cycle of mammals was discussed in science. We've also been learning about different careers in French. We had lots of fun making and sharing cakes with our family and friends on Thursday for MacMillan cancer Trust as well!
JAMAICA	This week in Jamaica we have had a fun week filled with exciting, educational activities. In English, we had to write a persuasive paragraph persuading Mrs Gilbert to add 5 more minutes to break time. After our hard work in English, we moved on to topic. All of the class got a list of countries and had listed the country's coordinates, continent, capital city and much more. Moving on to PSHE, we learnt all about peer pressure. Splitting peer pressure into two words and finding the definition of each. Soon we put the pieces together and found out that peer pressure means, the people your work close with or your friends pressuring you to do something that you don't want to do. 



What is the Short Breaks programme?

With the support of local businesses, the Isle of Wight Council's Short Breaks team has curated lots of fun activities specifically for young people on the Isle of Wight, with disabilities and/or additional needs. If you want to participate and are eligible (see below) - you will need to complete a simple form to take part.

Can I do Short Breaks activities?

If you answer 'yes' to the following you are eligible to join in Short Breaks activities.

- I am eighteen years old or younger.
- I have a disability and/or additional need that means I need support to join in leisure and recreational activities.
- I live on the lovely Isle of Wight and/or go to school here.

Are there any other benefits?

Yes, if you are eligible for Short Breaks, you and your family can also use the caravan at Shanklin, which is equipped for people with disabilities. Find out more on page twenty.



Sounds fab! How do I join?

It's simple and free to join*. Visit iow.gov.uk/shortbreaks to complete an application form. You will also need to provide a passport size photograph.





Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance are Changing.

As set down by the Department for Education, penalty notices can be issued for unauthorised absence. With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024.

Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines will now be issued to each parent, for each child that was absent.

For example:

3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

5 consecutive days of term time leave

Penalty Notice Fines will be issued for Term Time Leave of 5 or more consecutive days. INSET training days are school days and can be included in the 5 or more consecutive days where there was intent to be absent for term time leave.

10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period.

1 First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

2 Second Offence

Within 3 years

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

3 Third Offence

And Any Further Offence (Within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate, due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about

WHAT ARE THE RISKS? The video game Final Fantasy XIV launched in 2010, and, despite being critically panned, it saw an overhaul that has made it one of the biggest success stories in gaming. Its huge world, epic story and versatile combat system have continued to draw in new players, but there's a lot that trusted adults need to be aware of - not least the cost of paying monthly to play.

GE RESTRICTIO

ALWAYS ONLINE

Final Fantasy XIV is an MMORPG, which stands for Massively Multiplayer Online Role-Playing Game. Much like World of Warcraft, players create a character in a chosen class and level up by completing quests to gain power and items. The game requires a constant internet connection, whether you're playing on PC, Mac, Playstation or Xbox, and there's no option to

REGULAR EXPANSIONS

As with similar titles in the genre, players can purchase expansions to unlock additional content for the game. Those without the expansions will be locked out of certain new quests and activities, meaning that young people who play regularly will potentially have the next release earmarked on their calendar, ready to buy it as soon as possible

IN-GAME PURCHASES & SUBSCRIPTION FEE

Users need to pay £8.99 per month to play Final Fantasy XIV, but there is a free trial. If someone stops paying, there is all see access to their character (although they'll be able to pick up the payments again and resume where they left off). If a player forgets to cancel their payments, however, those subscription fees will continue rolling on automatically.

VOICE & TEXT CHAT

Final Fantasy XIV lets players send chat messages in-game or speak to each other over voice chat. On the one hand, that provides plenty of choice for how those enjoying the game can interact with their fellow fans. On the other hand, however, it's easier than in many games to receive unprompted messages from a stranger, with whom you constantly share your play space.

VIOLENCE

While Final Fantasy XIV has a fairly light tone throughout some of its quests, many involve killing enemies and sometimes even wild animals. The violence isn't especially strong more comparable to a cartoon or anime style -but the act alone may make some children feel uncomfortable, if they're not yet able to separate fictional harm from the real kind.

POTENTIAL FOR ADDICTION

As with World of Warcraft, there's an element of addiction to Final Fantasy XIV. The gameplay loop can be quite engrossing, as minutes turn into hours and hours into days while playing alone or with friends. This can potentially lead to missing real-life events, a lack of interest in any activities not related to the game and procrastination around responsibilities like schoolwork.

Advice for Parents & Educators

MANAGE PLAYTIME

(30 Playtime limits are a great way to counter the addictive qualities of games like Final Fantasy XIV. They allow you discuss why it's still important to enjoy things outside of gaming while still letting a child enjoy playing online with their friends when it makes sense to do so. It's all well and good to have fun with a gar so long as they're able to step away and reconnect with the real world.

PLAY TOGETHER

The free trial makes it extremely easy to jump into Final Fantasy XIV and play alongside a child, provided they re old enough. Not only does that help you ensur that settings are adjusted for their privacy and safety, but it may also end up becoming a bonding experience for you both and any other family members that want to try it out.

MAKE USE OF THE FREE TRIAL

he Final Fantasy XIV free trial is a generous one, with no limits on how long omeone can play until their character hits level 70. That's easily dozens of hours or a child to go through the game, complete quests, and see if they enjoy it befor unchasing expansions or subscribing to a membership. They may well move on omething else before you need to spend so much as a penny.

REMEMBER, IT'S A PEGI 16

Despite its often-relaxing nature, Final Fantasy XIV carries a PEGI 16 rating for violence and drugs (although the latter is due to a character smoking a pipe on occasion). There's minimal blood, but characters can attack enemies (and other







