

BAHAMAS	This week in Cuba and Bahamas we have been focusing on the harvest festival. We have been practicing our harvest festival song, exploring different harvest objects like pumpkins, autumn leaves, soup sensory trays and play dough with pine cones and small pumpkins to press into the dough. We have also made lovely autumnal pictures using different natural objects found in the playground. We have had a brilliant week!	
CUBA		
HAWAII	This week in Hawaii Class, the children's completed art day! The children used their knowledge of the layers of the rainforest to make polystyrene prints. They practised mixing primary colours to make a variety of different colours and predicted what colours they would make. We then had an art gallery for some of the adults in school where the children showcase their amazing prints.	
ANTIGUA	This week in Antigua, we have been answering the question: why do leaves change colour in Autumn? We ventured on an Autumn leaf hunt through our garden and used these leaves to make our very own wreaths. We have been exploring the crispy texture of the leaves as well as talking about their colours and sizes. We have also been developing our fine motor skills by printing leaves in playdough and threading! It wasn't just leaves we have been looking at the children have also been exploring our autumnal tuff tray filled with pine cones, acorns, logs and sticks!	
ST LUCIA	This week in St Lucia we have been focussing on Autumn and Harvest. Our book of the week this week has been The Little Red Hen. The children have really enjoyed learning the story and retelling it using the stick puppets as the characters. We discussed that the Little Red Hen did no share the bread as the other animals didn't help, how would they feel and should the other animals help if they want some of the yummy warm bread! We made our very own Little Red Hen using our hand prints and explored pumpkins from Godshill Farm! We had big pumpkins, small pumpkins, bumpy pumpkins! We then had a go at making our own by printing with apples and decorating them!	
MALDIVES	Wow, I cannot believe we have finished the first half term. The children have been amazing and all made progress, I am so proud. In maths we have been looking at number bonds to ten and trying to do them systematically. In English, we wrote our letter to Mummy Pig to tell her what had been happening. In science, we conducted a scientific enquiry and decided what was a suitable material for an umbrella for Ted. In art and design, we made a sculpture using natural materials. In PE, we have continued to learn how to play golf. Have a lovely half term.	
NEW ZEALAND	This week in New Zealand, we visited Teddy Town in science. Poor Ted had spent all weekend getting wet so we needed to carry out an experiment on materials to see which one would be best to use to make Ted his own umbrella. The children worked really hard together to carry out fair tests and all found they would use plastic for Ted's umbrella.	
MALTA	What an exciting final week of this half term we have had! This week Malta class has been very creative, we have finished our Art unit by making woolly mammoths out of milk cartons and completed our Topic unit by making our very own Iron Age roundhouses. On Tuesday we visited the Roman Villa and explored the impact the Romans had on Britain after the Iron Age and had a go at becoming archaeologists, discovering artefacts and discussing what we thought they might have been used for in prehistoric times. We are finishing the week with a RE day looking at how trees are used as symbols. I hope you all have a wonderful half term!	
GALAPAGOS	What a busy half term we have had! Galapagos Class have continued to work hard right to the end of term. We had a brilliant day at the Wildheart Sanctuary on Tuesday, learning about different animals and their habitats. We have also finished off our textiles topic making a dinosaur teddy and using our sewing skills. We have also secured our understanding of addition and subtraction using a formal written method and written an adventure story. I think we all deserve a little break!	

ICELAND	We've had an amazing week! We've been practicing hard for harvest festival, playing together as that TEAM in hockey and have written our non-chronological reports in English. In Wednesday, Mrs Cooney came in to talk to us all about map making and we did a treasure hunt using maps to find clues!
JAMAICA	This week in Jamaica we have been learning vital skills to save lives! On Wednesday, we had a trip we will never forget. We hopped in our minibus and drove to Sandown Fire Station! When we walked, we were immediately met with warm greetings by our instructor. We explored a fire truck and our friendly instructor named so many interesting features of the fire truck. After, we explored the fire truck, we went upstairs to be taught professionally how to do CPR. The CPR instructor was very sweet; She let us ask questions, practise on dummies and much more. Overall it was an amazing experience and now we all know how to save someone's life when they're in cardiac arrest. That was Jamaica's week!





## What is the Short Breaks programme?

With the support of local businesses, the Isle of Wight Council's Short Breaks team has curated lots of fun activities specifically for young people on the Isle of Wight, with disabilities and/or additional needs. If you want to participate and are eligible (see below) - you will need to complete a simple form to take part.

## Can I do Short Breaks activities?

If you answer 'yes' to the following you are eligible to join in Short Breaks activities.

- I am eighteen years old or younger.
- I have a disability and/or additional need that means I need support to join in leisure and recreational activities.
- I live on the lovely Isle of Wight and/or go to school here.

### Are there any other benefits?

Yes, if you are eligible for Short Breaks, you and your family can also use the caravan at Shanklin, which is equipped for people with disabilities. Find out more on page twenty.

It's simple and free to join\*. Visit iow.gov.uk/shortbreaks to complete an application form. You will also need to provide a passport size photograph.





## Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance are Changing.

As set down by the Department for Education, penalty notices can be issued for unauthorised absence. With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024.

## Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines will now be issued to each parent, for each child that was absent.

#### For example:

3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

## 5 consecutive days of term time leave

Penalty Notice Fines will be issued for Term Time Leave of 5 or more consecutive days. INSET training days are school days and can be included in the 5 or more consecutive days where there was intent to be absent for term time leave.

## 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period.

## 1 First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

## 2 Second Offence

#### Within 3 years

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

## 3 Third Offence

#### And Any Further Offence (Within 3 years)


The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate, due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.
