If you have misplaced any of the forms just let the office know and we can send home a duplicate.
- 3. **Attendance** Just to let you know our EWS Officer will be undertaking monthly checks for the whole school's attendance. Please can I remind you that after 8.20am for KS2 , 8.25am for KS1 and 8.30 8.45am for EYFS your child will be marked late unless agreed by myself. We work very closely with our EWS service. All children need to be in school on time every day and Mr Gard will be coming in and checking this throughout the school year. At the same time our registers for attendance are checked daily for patterns of absences and annual days off are closely monitored. If Mr Gard and our Family Liaison Officer Mrs Willshire feel you would benefit from a support meeting, please do not feel offended if you received an invite. We are all here to help to ensure the children are In school daily and on time.

90% and below equates to 20-30 school days off each year (100-150 lessons lost)


We want our children at Brading CE Primary to enjoy coming to school.

WHAT V	VE HAVE BEEN LEARNING ABOUT THIS WEEK
CUBA	This week in Cuba we have been looking at Goldilocks and the three bears. We have been looking to beards in oats in our sensory trays, mixing bowls with oats in for fine motor and stomping around the playground like bears for gross motor. We have shared the Goldilocks story we each other and counted 1, 2,3 bears!
HAWAII	This week in Hawaii Class, the children have been making structures using papier mache. The children made a penguin out of tin foil. they then covered it in a material so the papier mache would stick. They then layered the papier mache to make the structure strong. They all ended up very sticky! We also created our own branching databases in science using scientific vocabulary such as carnivore, habitat and vertebrate.
ANTIGUA / ST LUCIA	This week in EYFS we have been focusing on Teddy Bear's Picnic. We used junk modelling to make and paint our own food for the picnic. We also named our teddies and reception wrote invites to ask the teddies to come to our own picnic. Finally, we ended the week having our own teddy bears picnic - we made our own jam sandwiches to try.





Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance are Changing.

As set down by the Department for Education, penalty notices can be issued for unauthorised absence. With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024.

Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines will now be issued to each parent, for each child that was absent.

For example:
3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

5 consecutive days of term time leave

Penalty Notice Fines will be issued for Term Time Leave of 5 or more consecutive days. INSET training days are school days and can be included in the 5 or more consecutive days where there was intent to be absent for term time leave.

10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Second Offence

Within 3 years

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

3 Third Offence

And Any Further Offence (Within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate, due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.


