- 2. **School Photos** It was so lovely to see all the children looking so happy for their photos on Monday. As soon as the order forms have arrived back in school we will get these out to you.
- 3. As class teachers are so busy first thing in the morning getting things ready for learning and as we need to get learning started on time as there is so much to get through during the day, teachers are <u>not</u> available to talk to anyone before school or when they are bringing in their classes. Mrs Willshire or myself will be available from 8.30 to help support anyone.
- 4. Reading/Homework/Diaries -
- Diaries: Just a quick reminder that school diaries came home last week. They included our TRUST breakdown for learning and behaviour as well our zones of regulations for behaviour and learning and what we are using in school as part of our behaviour policy. If you have any questions please come and see me. We have thought about all aspects of these in great detail. All of these will help the children get ready for secondary school and the expectations there. It was so lovely that our OFSTED Inspector praised us in June for how we support individual children's needs.

WHAT WE HAVE BEEN LEARNING ABOUT THIS WEEK				
CUBA	This week in Cuba we have been focusing on the teddy bears picnic and "all about me" like looking at home photos and seeing what foods we like! We have had such a lovely week despite the weather!			
HAWAII	This week in Hawaii Class the children have been learning about invertebrates. We classified them based on their features. We then went around the school finding different invertebrates and deciding which group they belong to. The children drew and labelled a sketch of their favourite invertebrate.			
ANTIGUA / ST LUCIA	This week our focus has been on Goldilocks and the three bears. We have explored porridge, cut Goldilocks hair and made teddy bear artwork. In maths we were thinking about matching objects so we found Daddy bear some new matching socks to keep his feet warm. Finally, we visited the trim trail and tried the bikes and scooters			
NEW ZEALAND	This week, the children have been learning about how to use comparison symbols and language when comparing numbers in maths. In English, we have started to learn how to retell the story of The Three Little Pigs using Talk for Writing. Mummy Pig has written a letter to the children and they are learning the features of a letter so they can reply to her! We are applying our skills learned in phonics into our reading and writing and in PSHE, we have been learning about rules at school and home. We had a local author visit this week and the children thoroughly enjoyed their session. The children were participating in activities from one of her books. Her name is Lottie from Lemon Jelly Press. GALAPAGOS	This week Galapagos class have worked so hard! We have further explored our topic of rainforests, learning all about the layers of the rainforest, what animals and plants live there and the climate. In English we have began to explore our text driver 'The Kapok Tree'. The children made predictions from the cover and are now working on practicing the features needed for our persuasive letters, including rhetorical questions and expanded noun phrases. We had a very exciting maths lesson looking at number lines to 1000, the children made giant number lines on the tables and we able to complete the number lines even with varying start and end points as well as intervals. The children absolutely love being able to draw on the tables! Finally in science we learnt all about how animals are classified. Using a classification key we were able to sort animals into 5 groups, either fish, birds, mammals, amphibians or reptiles. We look forward to learning more next week, have a great weekend!			
JAMAICA	This week in Jamaica class, we have been busy planning and writing our diary entry. We wrote our diaries from the perspective of an explorer, travelling across the Americas. In topic, we looked compared Alaska and Brazil, recognising their different climate zones. On Tuesday, we had a visit from sight for Wight who came in to run a workshop to raise awareness of those living in society with a visual impairment.

















Foodbank Vouchers

Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance are Changing.

As set down by the Department for Education, penalty notices can be issued for unauthorised absence. With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024.

Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines will now be issued to each parent, for each child that was absent.

For example:
3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

5 consecutive days of term time leave

Penalty Notice Fines will be issued for Term Time Leave of 5 or more consecutive days. INSET training days are school days and can be included in the 5 or more consecutive days where there was intent to be absent for term time leave.

10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Second Offence

Within 3 years

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

3 Third Offence

And Any Further Offence (Within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate, due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.

GERESTRICTION

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

With over 900 million active monthly users and billions of 'Snaps' sent each month, Snapchat is a popular messaging app among children and young people. It allows users to share fun, spontaneous pictures and videos with friends and family while using playful filters. One of Snapchat's unique features is that pictures, videos and messages are only viewable for a short period of time.

ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE

Snapchat's use of artificial intelligence (AI) includes features like the 'My AI' chatbot and AI-powered filters, offering interactive experiences that can be fun but also pose risks. These tools may share unfiltered or inaccurate responses, promote unrealistic beauty standards, and collect personal data. Advanced filters and deepfake-style lenses can distort reality, potentially leading to manipulation, impropressing as improportion, as incorporation, as impropressing as incorporation. impersonation, or inappropriate content.

SCREEN ADDICTION

Snapchat boosts user engagement and daily use with features like streaks (daily Snapchat exchange with reatures like streaks (aanly snapchat exchanges between you and a friend). When a streak's been going for a few days, users will see a semoji. The number alongside it shows the number of days, but if users miss a day and break the streak, the only way to restore it is to pay. This encourages daily use habits, and frequent notifications can keep users returning to

SEXTORTION

Because Snapchat's disappearing messages feature may foster a sense of safety, users may become targets of sextortion. For example, a predator may pressure someone into sending nude images, then somehow capture those images to threaten and intimidate the victim. This might involve claiming they will share the images with friends or family unless

SNAPCHAT+

Snapchat+ is the platform's premium subscription service, offering early access to new and exclusive features. In June 2025, Snapchat introduced a new tier called Lens+, giving subscribers access to hundreds of lenses and AR experiences for playing, creating, and sharing Snaps. These paid features may encourage young users to spend money to access exclusive content, increasing the risk of overspending or feeling pressured to make in-app purchases.

ACCESSIBILITY

Snapchat is now accessible from a web brow meaning children can use it on a laptop or tablet without downloading the app. This can make activity harder to monitor, reduce the effectiveness of parental controls, and increase the risk of unsupervised

INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

Some content on Snapchat isn't suitable for children. The hashtags used to group content are determined by the poster, so even an innocent search term could still yield age-inappropriate results. The app's disappearing messages feature also makes it easy for young people to share explicit images on impulse – so sexting continues to be a risk associated with Snapchat.

Advice for Parents & Educators

ACCESS THE SNAPCHAT FAMILY SAFETY HUB

Created with guidance from Common Sense Media, Snapchat has developed a Family Safety Hub that explains how the app works and how to use its in-app protections for teens. It's recommended that you review this guidance before allowing a child to download Snapchat. Remember, the op is only intended for children aged 13 and over

BLOCK AND REPORT

If a stranger connects with a child on Snapchat and makes them feel uncomfortable by pressuring them to send or receive unwanted or inappropriate images, the child can tap the three dots on that person's profile to report or block them There are options to state why they're reporting that user, with a tailored reporting option to report somebody for threatening to leak sexually explicit images, or 'nudes

ENCOURAGE OPEN DISCUSSIONS

about scams and blackmail before letting children sign up. If they're lured into a scam, encourage them to tell you immediately. Talk openly and non-judgementally about sexting, emphasising its inherent risks. Furthermore, explain how popular 'challenges' on the platform can have harmful consequences.

USE PRIVACY SETTINGS TOGETHER

Sit down with the children in your care and explore Snapchat's privacy settings as a shared activity. You can help them adjust who can contact them, view their stories, or see their location on Snap Map. It's a good opportunity to explain why some settings are safer than others, reinforcing their understanding of online boundaries. Encourage them to regularly review these settings, especially after app updates or Encourage them to regularly review to changes in their friendship groups.
