

What we have been learning this week			
ANTIGUA	This week in Antigua we have continued our theme of super heroes! We have had a great week making captain America shields, making hand print super heroes with capes, built superhero cities in the sand pit and so much more! Superhero yoga was a real hit, we moved like superhero's and acted out all of our superhero powers. We dressed up as superhero's today which was so lovely to see all the fabulous outfits!		
ST LUCIA	This week in St Lucia we have been finishing our week on superheroes. We have been reading the book Supertato! We helped the frozen vegetables escape from The Evil Pea! We made words from supertato and created our own superhero assault course. The children have loved this topic and have really impressed me with their work, including writing questions for the super heroes such as "why did you choose to help people?" We have had a blast during superhero dress up day and loved all the costumes!!		
MALDIVES	This week in Year 1 we have been counting in 2's, 5's and 10's. We have then been deciding if groups are equal or unequal. We then made equal groups with counters. In Geography we have been looking at similarities and differences between the Isle of Wight and the Isle of Struay. In PE we have been working on our fitness by playing fun games on the astro turf.		
NEW ZEALAND	This week in New Zealand class has been super exciting! We have been working hard on fractions - looking at what makes the whole. In English, we've been writing our very own portal narratives inspired by the book 'Journey'. For PE, we've been hitting the courts and perfecting our tennis skills. And in Science, we've been learning all about the life cycle of plants - from seed to blooming beauty! It's been a jam-packed week filled with learning and fun activities.		
MALTA	This week in Malta class we have published a non- chronological report on the Blitz. As part of our topic, the children researched the significance of the Blitz in World War 2 and applied their knowledge to their final piece of English writing using prepositions and inverted commas. On Thursday, we looked at P.E activities in French. The children learnt a range of movements and matched them to French picture cards.		
GALAPAGOS	We've had a very packed all be it shorter week this week! We've been polishing our biking stories, investigating which electrical items are powered by mains and battery. In PE we've been practicing controlling the ball in tennis. In maths we've been learning about the value of money and in French we've learned what countries are in each continent.		
ICELAND	This week in Iceland we have had lots of fun with out topic 'Welcome to Brading' and our Science top: Forces! Let's Get into it! In our topic 'Welcome to Brading' we have been using our creativity skills and making ancient buildings in their old form! We are working to make the full village. JAMAICA	This week in Year 6 we have had an excellent week. In maths we have been doing arithmetic tests and revision in preparation for our SATs. 
















This week in Football Club...

In football club this week we wore our kit that we won from the premier league girls football competition! It looked so good and the girls were playing so well in it we can't wait for our first game!


