What another amazing week we have had.

Remembrance Service – I would just like to thank Rev Bev for coming in and leading our Remembrance Worship on Tuesday morning, where all the classes brought their poppy wreaths. In addition, one of our year 5 pupils read out a poem and then everyone listened to Rev Bev talk through all the colours of a poppy. Finally, we undertook a minute's silence at 11am for all those that have fought in combat, as we felt it was such an important topic, especially as it is the 80year anniversary of the end of the second word war. The whole school then took part in a remembrance afternoon to help them increase their cultural capital and learn more about British history.

WHAT W	E HAVE BEEN LEARNING ABOUT THIS WEEK		
CUBA	We have had a lovely week looking at our topic of remembrance. The children have enjoyed making a wreath using red handprints and using peppers to print and chalk to draw poppies. We had a very special bucket session where we explored a poppy scarf and a poppy from the Tower of London.		
HAWAII	This week in Hawaii Class, the children celebrated Remembrance Day. They made poppies to wear, learnt why we celebrate Remembrance Day and took part in the 2 minutes silence. We then continued by learning about what life was like for an evacuee in World War 2 including rations. The children had rationed amounts of bread and butter to share between them and thought about how this would've affected children.		
ANTIGUA / ST LUCIA	Our Early Years focus this week has been Remembrance. We have shared things we remember, talk about important people to remember and why the poppy is special. We have made our own poppies, poppy wreaths and poppy biscuits.		
NEW ZEALAND	This week we started with our hook with a visit from a fireman! The children loved hearing all about his role and this has really helped writing non-chronological reports. In maths, we have been looking at tens and ones. We finished sewing our poppies in art and design. We made a wreath and took part in some lovely Remembrance activities. Well done everybody!		
GALAPAGOS	This week Galapagos have enjoyed a wonderful trip to the cinema, the children were so well behaved and represented the school amazingly! This week we have also learnt all about remembrance, we made a poppy wreath and our own poppies, wrote some lovely poems and finished by continuing to explore our WW2 topic looking at the roles of responsibilities of the people in the war. In art we experimented using a range of paintbrushes, we then discussed which ones were our favourite and least favourite. Have a lovely weekend!		
JAMAICA	This week in Jamaica class, we have had a very busy week. On Tuesday, we carried out various activities for Remembrance Day, and took part in our whole school worship to commemorate all comrades from across the world. On Wednesday, we took a trip to Cineworld for the annual film festival. We watched the film "if" which explored the world of imaginary friends. In Thursday, we continued our journey into the Ancient Maya by discussing the importance of religion and the gods from the past.







Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance are Changing.

As set down by the Department for Education, penalty notices can be issued for unauthorised absence. With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024.

Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines will now be issued to each parent, for each child that was absent.

For example:

3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

5 consecutive days of term time leave

Penalty Notice Fines will be issued for Term Time Leave of 5 or more consecutive days. INSET training days are school days and can be included in the 5 or more consecutive days where there was intent to be absent for term time leave.

10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period.

1 First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for

Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

2 Second Offence

Within 3 years

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

3 Third Offence

And Any Further Offence (Within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate, due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.
