Sports Report

Children across the school have made a great start to PE this term. Pupils in Reception to Year 2 have continued to develop their fundamental movement skills, focusing on balance, coordination and control. Alongside this, most classes across the school have begun new dance units, exploring a wide range of dance styles. Children have been enjoying learning how to move with control, expression and rhythm. They are working together to create and perform routines. We are very proud of the progress and confidence children are showing in their physical skills and their positive attitudes towards PE. If you're worried about a child—whether it's your own or another—you can:

- **Speak to a DSL directly at school.**
- **Call the school office** and ask to speak to someone about a safeguarding concern.
- **Email the school** with your concern, marking it as confidential.

All concerns are taken seriously and dealt with in line with our safeguarding policy. Together, we can ensure that Coxhoe Primary remains a safe and happy place for all our children to learn and grow.

Careers Corner

"Career-related learning in primary schools is not about setting pupils down a specific path but ensuring they understand that there are many options open to them... to learn about the world around them".

"Which jobs help keep County Durham's heritage and countryside special?"

Answer:

County Durham and the Northeast are famous for their beautiful countryside, historic mining heritage and amazing outdoor spaces. Lots of people work in jobs that help protect these places so future generations can enjoy them too! Some examples include:

- **Rangers and Countryside Officers** – They look after places like Hardwick Park, Hamsterley Forest and Durham Heritage Coast by protecting wildlife, maintaining footpaths and running activities for families.
- **Archaeologists** – They help uncover and protect our region's rich history, including old mining sites and Roman remains like at Beamish and Binchester Roman Fort.
- **Heritage Officers and Museum Educators** – They work in places like Beamish Museum and Durham Cathedral, helping people learn about local history.
- **Environmental Scientists** – They study the local environment, from rivers like the Wear to woodland habitats, and help solve problems such as pollution or climate change.
- **Community Engagement Workers** – They help local communities get involved in looking after parks, nature trails, and local heritage projects.

If you have any connections to these careers, we would love for you to come into school to talk to our children about the fabulous work that you are doing.

SEND and Inclusion

Question of the Month: "What is a Support Plan Review and why are they important?"

A **Support Plan Review** is a termly meeting where school staff and parents come together to look at how well a child's current SEND support is working. It's a chance to reflect on the child's progress, talk about what strategies have been successful and update targets so they continue to meet the child's needs. Parents' insights are an important part of the process, as they help build a complete picture of how the child is doing both in school and at home.

These reviews are important because they make sure the support a child receives stays relevant, consistent and effective. Needs can change over time and reviews allow staff to make adjustments early so the child continues to feel confident and supported. They also help everyone stay on the same page (teachers, support staff, parents and the child) so there is a clear plan for the next steps and continuity throughout the school year. If your child has a support plan, you will shortly receive your invite to our Spring term reviews.

Music Update

We have started our year off incredibly and can't wait for the opportunities that 2026 will bring us. The children have begun their new units across school and they are all continuing to develop their skills as performers and composers. We are excited to announce the beginning of our small group piano lessons in school and the continuation of our strings, woodwind and brass lessons.
